PUBLIC SPEAKS: Brenda Baylor opposing the opening of the Ambassador Hotel to be used for a rehabilitation facility for exconvicts. She and others have obtained 575 signatures in three days times all against this facility. She stated that Canton City residents should be aware that in the area being discussed they are surrounded by Canton Township and this facility will effect them and their children as well. Brenda also thanked The Repository for making people aware that this action was in progress because none of the residents of the area knew this building was to be used as a re-entry facility. Jennifer Zachary is the mother of children that wait at the bus stop by the Ambassador Hotel and she is concerned over the number of wooded areas that are all around this community. She does agree that rehabilitation has to exist for these persons but feels that it should be in an area with more supervision and less children and she states that she is aware property values in the neighborhood will be affected with this type of center. Linda Stevens wants to know why former inmates are being permitted to come into a residential area that is only 8/10's of a mile away from a school. Many of the people that will be residing at the Ambassador were convicted of sexual crimes and should not have access to these students and she fears that many will be inmates again at some point in life. She is questioning why the Reverend that is sponsoring this program has not chosen his own neighborhood for this establishment. Bruce Schorsten was speaking as both a landlord and a realtor with concern over the new housing standards that are being introduced to amend title seven of the building code ordinance. He does agree that the city needs codes in place to keep rental properties safe but feels that this is designed just to raise various fees to the homeowners and will not change the status of some of the structures. Bruce is fearful that more good landlords will begin selling their properties to escape the new regulations and leave more properties in Canton vacant or purchased by the slum lords that do not maintain their properties now. Mike Rukavina is opposing the amending of Title 17 Housing Code because there are approximately 30 items with the language of the Ordinance of concern. He is an owner of several properties within Canton and stated that 55% of the city's housing is rentals for investments because of the current housing market. He stated that he and other members of the association are professional housing providers not just landlords that are interested in helping Canton correct bad housing situations and foreclosure issue. They had met with Angela Cavanaugh previously to discuss the changes that need to take place with this Ordinance but what is being presented is not accurate as discussed. Bill Malloy is a member of the Ohio Architects and former Chief Building Inspector. He provides housing for over 100 individuals and has for the last 28 years. He thought that after the meeting with Ms. Cavanaugh that all would be winners, the City, the landlords, and the residents but many items are not included or worded correctly within the Ordinance as written today and it contains both loopholes and errors that prevent inspectors for doing what needs done with some of the houses in violation. He will donate any time needed to discuss the changes that need made to clean up this Ordinance prior to adopting it and feels that with all sides working together this could be accomplished in a week.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Member West asking for copies of any proposed changes to the Housing Code Ordinance from the landlords/property owners for review before the committee meeting next week. Member Smuckler also request copies as a Member of the Judiciary committee and also asked of the Law Department what could legally be done to assist the people of Canton Township with the facility at the Ambassador Hotel. Assistant City Law Director Kris Bates stating that nothing could actually be done from a legal standpoint but that maybe the political influence of some Members of Council to some of the Canton Township trustees would be beneficial.
