PUBLIC HEARINGS: (None)

PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Denisha Mays lives at the YWCA on 6th St NE and wanted to commend Chris Smith and Thomas West for being African American leaders in the community. She stated that it is essential to staying positive in these times and encourages Council to speak with the mortgage lenders in the area to help stop homelessness. Christine Peterson gave all Members of Council and the Administration a booklet for lent regarding the truth through prayer to help guide them in the decisions for our city. Jason Scaglione asked Council to let all of their constituents know about the various Neighborhood Associations which help to open the lines of communications in our community. All citizens can belong somewhere and sometimes these associations can help the other neighbors with special needs in times of shoveling, mowing, etc. Urie Hershberger owns a 9 unit apartment building on Walnut NE that he has cleaned up from the point of being on the demolition list and has seen what a difference his efforts in this building have made to the entire neighborhood, however since he did all of the work, the county raised his property taxes and now the city has raised his water and sanitation rates. He checked into a private sanitation service which has lower rates but found that the city has an Ordinance against using a private service for trash removal within the city so he has asked that the administration permit him to use another sanitation service or meet the rates of that company. Daniel Coen does not live in Canton but he owns over 100 homes in the city and has spent a large amount on renovations and in property taxes. When Mr. Coen began purchasing homes it was with the intention of remodeling them and selling them to other homeowners however the economy did not permit that to happen and now he has had to become a landlord. He is a good landlord for our city and is in support of the IPMC because all of his homes meet code. He is upset that the burden of repair lays on the landlord and not the individual homeowner or the tenants. He feels that all homeowners should be treated equally whether they live in the property or rent it out to others and should be responsible for the same repairs and upkeep to keep our neighborhoods in good condition. Brigid Brockway from the Unitary Universeless Congregation of Canton standing on the side of love to stop oppression of gays, lesbians, bisexuals and transgenders none of which should be discriminated against because of their orientation. She presented Members of Council with Valentine cards. Dave Kirven discussing the IPMC if Canton is being so restrictive of their codes then why has the rental property increased from 40% in the 1990's to 60% now. City Council should be applauded for keeping the safety of the residents in mind while reviewing the new codes. All local contractors feel the inspections should continue and will help with the employment of the trade workers in our city. Dan Fonte has been listening to the back and forth comments regarding the IPMC and the fact that all still have questions. He feels that Council should slow down and take their time in getting this Ordinance and code right by having all of their questions answered and their needs met so that when the new International Property Maintenance Code is passed for Canton they have legislation that they can be proud of not something that will need amended on a regular basis. Ida Ross Freeman has seen changes in the community but not enough changes in minorities employment in this city.

Safety Director Ream informing all that another senior firefighter has decided to take the buyout offered and the last three firefighters that were on layoff will be returning to work next week. Mayor Healy discussing the drop in crime rates and the effects of the drop in population as well. Crime is down about 30% in the last two years but the population has not dropped that amount. He will be hosting a Town Hall meeting on Wednesday, February 24th at 6:30 at the Canton Patrolman's Union Hall located at 430 Walnut Ave to answer questions regarding crime. Member Butterworth announcing a public meeting to be held Wednesday, 2/24/10 here in the Chamber regarding an electronic billboard installation at 38th and Guilford Ave NW. Majority Leader Dougherty thanking the Police for all the hard work with the drop in crime but mentioning that over the weekend in Ward 5 Security and employees of Aultman Hospital assisted Police in the arrest of 2 individuals who were breaking into vehicles.
