PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Vince Watts agrees that local workers need employed but he does feel that the local unions are not a good representation for the minorities. He is here to represent the last hired, first fired group that have probably been out of work longer than some of the union workers that are now 16 months unemployed. 53% of the minorities within Stark County live in the city limits of Canton and Mr. Watts would like to see all of the local unions diversify their memberships and put all people to work when jobs open up. Ken Ash is objecting to the zone change at 1750 Ira Turpin Way because there are already several listed sex offenders within his neighborhood and in Ward 2 so he doesn't feel that there is a need for a home for ex-convicts and sex offenders in this area. Mr. Ash asked if the same laws apply to parks and playgrounds as apply to schools for offenders to be at this proximity. Jim Adams thanking Council for the continued support of Public Health Programming. Every dollar that Council approves can be levied into additional dollars through grants and other public health avenues to support programs such as WIC. One in every two children in this country are now fed through a WIC program. These Public Health Programs now help people obtain vaccinations and immunizations, breathe cleaner air, drink cleaner water and have a longer life expectancy. Thomas Howell is asking for help within his neighborhood from some of the city services such as Police and Sanitation. He has requested things from getting trees trimmed to calling for cruisers and being told he is not in a high crime area. Mr. Howell has a Neighborhood Association and has repeatedly invited people from the Administration to attend meetings so that the residents can voice their concerns and no one has shown up. Last week he had passed out flyers and advertised in the newspaper for a large meeting and ended up cancelling the meeting 30 minutes after it was to start because of lack of attendance. Antoine Hodge speaking on behalf of the C.M.B.-3 Corporation. They will be holding a meeting at 5 PM on Tuesday 5/18/10 at Monroe and Tuscarawas to discuss the 501(3)C status of the public holdings. Jennifer Lewis thanking all Council for being present in her neighborhood and the reduction of gun shots. She is actually getting more sleep at night but is concerned about the city cruisers being sold without being repainted or stripped of equipment because now there are gang members in her area that are in a vehicle that could pass as a police cruiser. Mrs. Lewis would like the Health Department to investigate some of the landlords that own vacant homes and allow tall grass and trash at their homes because she has seen many violations including rodents around her home. Dick Deitrick is here to speak for the Veteran's regarding the Memorial Day parade fees for protection. He would like to know just who is requesting these fees and is very sad that Massillon has said if Canton would still like to have a parade it could be held there for free. Ida Ross Freeman thinks that the gang members have moved to her neighborhood because she hears a lot of gun fire there now. She would like to have the city review their hiring policies to include more minorities that want to work because people need to be aware that African Americans are not the only minorities and anyone in the minor majority fits that category. Kristen Moore of the Kingdom House Ministries is discussing a pilot program for the emphasis of education on application within the community for lifetime servants. She hopes that Canton can achieve greater unity with Canton Peace Day. Catherine Bules is a member of the Kingdom House and is serving at both Lighthouse Ministries and Belden Elementary School. This small but passionate group is having a Peace Day event at Nimisilla Park on May 30<sup>th</sup> from 1 to 7PM in hopes of helping to reconcile families. There will be faith based and community based organizations attending as well as a pot luck meal for all with music and dance to show all the diversities of Canton.
