PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Joe Thompson is re-addressing code 1351.01 and the new code enforcement. He still has not received answers to his questions and feels it was passed against his due process because the way this was presented to the people just was not fair. All of the banks and mortgage companies are excluded from the fees and many of the eyesores in the city are owned by them. Christine Peterson passed out the booklet "Seek God for the City" which provides guidance for everyday living and hope throughout lent with ideas to better the city. If all Council Members and the Administration seek daily prayer through truth, this resource could benefit the city. Ernest Moles lives behind Georgeview Estates in Canton Township and has been there for 25 years but never had a problem with flooding until these homes were built. He can't afford to replace his septic system and he has asked to be a part of the city and attached to the city sewer system since Mayor Purses was in office. He is asking the city to do something to stop this flooding problem. Louis Shurman discussed the lack of police response to an apparent crime wave in the city. He feels that there is a lack of priority by the Police Department. The traffic citations being up does help the city financially but does not stop any of the more violent crimes such as arson, stabbings or robberies that effect the people. In 2010 he had to file 14 police reports on some of his properties mostly in the Ridgewood area. He has developed technology to assist police in catching people that steal copper piping and other items from inside vacant homes. He is not a developer but has had help from all city departments to make this happen.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Member West was asking the Service Director about some very large pot holes on 12th St NW and he is afraid that a serious accident could occur while dodging these. He also wondered if the street would be ODOT's responsibility to maintain since it is a State Route. Member Smith informed Director Price that Mr. Zachary had not signed up for Public Speaks but would still like to speak with him after the meeting. Service Director Price told Member West that 12th Street is the city's responsibility to maintain. Member Cirelli asked Mayor Healy about the people working for him that make \$26,000.00 or less based on the conversation last week regarding the cadet firefighters. She has received a report from the Auditor's office which shows only 1 person making that amount. She also has many questions about city finances after the article in the newspaper listing some of the current cost savings by the city. Would he like to be asked those this evening or should she save them for the budget meeting tomorrow night. She mentioned that there have been constituents calling her

about the Corinthium column that will be outside the City Hall once the construction is complete and have said that it would be nice to have this as a goal post to show support for the Hall of Fame city. Mayor Healy responding to Member Cirelli regarding the salaries for his staff and the fact that they have not had raises since they came on board and also took furloughs last year to reduce their annual salary. He is open to meeting with her at any time to discuss any financial questions she may have. President Schulman telling Mr. Thompson that the IPMC meetings went on for a year prior to the passing of the Ordinance.
