MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Safety Director Price re: Advising that over 2,000 - 3,000 potholes were filled today and that the City is spending about \$4,000.00 a day for asphalt. He stated that adequate funding is not an issue, the issue is the manpower and starting next week all Street Department personnel will be back on the day shift filling potholes. Also he is looking into having the Park Department assist in patching; Member Cirelli re: Advising that she called the Street Superintendent about a pothole on 15th Street and a couple others and they were filled, she complimented Kevin Monroe for that. She stated that Mr. Monroe also advised her that patching potholes depends on the weather; Member West re: Thanked James Parker for his vision and passion for bringing Jim Thorpe's presence to downtown Canton and stated that he would fully support that. Also advised that Stark County Minority Health Coalition is having its 8th Minority Health Month celebration at Skyland Pines and the event is free; Member Smuckler re: Reiterated the comments that were made regarding Ordinance #8. Stated that he appreciates everything that was done with Willig Field and the money that was spent there but he does not appreciate the cost overrun. Feels that in all his years as a Council Member, this is the worst the streets have ever been and believes that the City should pave the streets rather than fill the potholes.
