MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Member West re: Expressing that his heart goes out to all the shooting victims. Relayed that there was a shooting at 1005 13th St NE and the police did go out that night and the next morning. Said that we need to keep fighting this and everyone's help is needed; Safety Director Ream re: Advised Rebecca Shrewsbury that the City does have cameras but they are all being used at this time and believes this is what the Chief meant when he told her there are no cameras. Also stated that the City will possibly be purchasing more cameras. Relayed to the Mardis' that the City does not condone this activity and there is an ongoing investigation with what happened to their home and with the incidents at 13th and Plain. Relayed that some of the forfeiture funds will be being used for upcoming overtime for the Police Department; Member Dougherty re: Relayed that he knows the cameras work and we should be looking at buying more not just talking about it; Member Hawk re: Concurred with Member Dougherty and commended the Police Officers but stated he doesn't feel there are enough of them out there; Member Cirelli re: Asked if the City still has a Drug Task Force, if there are more officers staffed on the weekends, how is busy time determined, if there are any plans for more officers, why they can't use HUD funds to hire more officers, and how long the City has had the Southeast Community Center; Safety Director Ream re: Relayed that there are still 2 members on the Drug Task Force and that he sent a communication down to Civil Service to get the process started for more officers; Mayor Healy re: Stated that the HUD funds are being used for the Southeast Community Center to keep the kids off the street; Member Barton re: Asked if the HUD funds that the City receives change yearly, if so he doesn't feel it would make sense to use these funds to hire new officers just to have to lay them off when the HUD funds are reduced the following year; Mayor Healy re: Stated that the funds do change from year to year and the Governor has already announced a reduction in HUD money; Member West re: Asked if it is possible to have surveillance signs posted where cameras are; Member Butterworth re: Asked if the recent shooting took place on Saturday at 2:02 AM what the delay was in having the Detectives come out this morning and wonders if that hurts the investigation; Safety Director Ream re: Advised that the Detectives do not work on the weekends and that doesn't necessarily hurt the investigation; Member Smuckler re: Relayed that a Canton Police Officer is telling people that there is no longer a Drug Task Force. Also stated that he is in support of selling Southeast Community Center to Stark Metropolitan Housing so that we can take CDBG money to fund Police Department; Law Director Martuccio re: Relayed the courage and professionalism that he witnessed recently with one of the Canton Police Officers; Member Cirelli re: Stated that she doesn't know what good putting up surveillance signs would be. Also described the home that was shot at on Hammond SW; Member Hawk re: Stated that it is up to Council to determine where to spend money and feels that the safety and welfare of the citizens are well worth spending the money; Mayor Healy re: Told how his grandmother's house and neighbors house was shot at years ago which made him want to run for office to make a difference. Expressed how the Administration has had to make priorities with limited amount of resources. Stated that he has not stopped making Zero Tolerance a priority.
