PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Richard Drake welcomed new Council Members. He explained what a certified arborist is and how they are able to care for trees. He feels that while a Tree Ordinance or Tree Commission would be nice, what Canton needs is a tree inspector like they had in the past that can maintain the trees all the time. Charles Killens states that the Mayor has City Hall looking very nice and if the new Council Members can do this in their Wards, the whole city will look nicer. He would like the Mayor to get on the Building Code Department and make them do their jobs to start the year right. Cindy Hall has made improvements to her home across from the old Lehman School but it will never be noticed because of the run down, crime ridden area. This has become a neighborhood that only low income renters will live in and they generally cause more problems in a neighborhood. She is afraid that the Wellness Clinic project will cause more problems and she holds the Canton City Schools, Council and the City partially responsible for allowing this all to happen. Dan Fonte speaking to all on the electric aggregation program that the city is now in the process of launching. There have been some bad laws passed at the state level and since there no longer is an Ohio Consumer Council many people are confused about these utilities. The new program will not permit anyone to be on a budget and most seniors need to be on a monthly budget because of their fixed income. He would like Council to get together with other cities, counties, etc and create legislation to force the state to look at the utilities and establish regulations. Michael Swintosky is the President of the North Lehman Neighborhood Alliance and they are very much in support of the Planning Commission's recommendation regarding the project at the old Lehman School. He is concerned about the time frame for the project moving along and is against any type of 24/7 business. They do not want to see any type of housing for clients and would like to verify that there will be off the road parking for individuals using the facility. He is requesting that the Neighborhood Association be invited to all meetings regarding this project in the future. Kathryn Ramsey congratulated new Council Members. She lives by a gentleman that was shot while breaking into a house to steal the copper plumbing. She feels that the city should do more to regulate scrappers to stop this type of crime because it brings grief to whole neighborhoods. Pat Kirk asked how many Council Members felt that a Tree Ordinance would cost the city money. She brought along 5 applications for the Tree Academy that Canton will be hosting this year beginning in March. This ODNR course is mainly for people that will be on the Tree Commission but anyone can attend for \$35.00 per class. Mayor Healy is an honored guest and will be able to attend for free. James Parker loves Canton but is concerned about Central Plaza. He does not want the Occupy Wall Street people coming into downtown and feels that both the Safety Director and the Law Director should be making plans for what they will do when these homeless, drunken people come into the square during Hall of Fame week claiming to be demonstrating for their country.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Member Griffin announcing that Canton received three awards at the 80th National Amateur Softball Association Meeting held in Myrtle Beach, SC at the Wilson Sporting Goods ceremony. To receive the James Ferrell Award for excellence a city must achieve a 95% or higher rating and Canton received this for hosting both the Girls Class B fast pitch tournament in July and also the Mens Class C Eastern National Championship tournament over Labor Day weekend. The ASA is considered a national governing body for softball and these tournaments and awards would not have been possible without the renovation of Willig Field. These were Canton's first national championship tournaments and between them they generated approximated \$1,250,000.00 with 65 teams representing 13 states. The hard work and dedication of many have helped Canton District 10 to be awarded with the 2012 National Eastern Coed Tournament and 2013 National C and D tournaments. Member Smith inviting all to a Martin Luther King breakfast on Thursday, January 12, 2012 at 8:00 am at the McKinley Grand Hotel and there will also be a gathering on Monday, January 16, 2012 at noon at the Southeast Community Center where Vince Watts will be the featured speaker. Member Fisher wanted to thank Mr. Bowman for his heroic efforts in Ward 5. He also stated that his children were in the audience and thought everyone but President Schulman was boring. Member West would like all Council Members to receive and review a copy of Communication #22 before the Committee Mtg for those items. He also feels the city is blessed to have Mr. Drake and Pat Kirk caring for the trees in the community. Member Cirelli asked that all family members of both new and old Council Members stand. President Schulman recognized Ryan Brahler for being a newly elected Member of the School Board. Law Director Martuccio responding to Dan Fonte about the aggregation problem for electricity stating that 11 years ago the utilities were deregulated so Canton began to broker for gas. At that time there was no need for electric aggregation but now AEP is beginning to increase prices because of older infrastructure costs

and the city was trying to get out in front of that before the rates jumped. First Energy offered the city 10% off of the current AEP rates for 3 years. All residents will be included unless you choose to opt out which will not cost anything if you do this upon receiving your information. If you wait and then opt out you will have to pay a \$100.00 cancellation fee. AEP will continue to send you one bill but it will be broken down by distribution, generation, transportation, etc costs so there will no longer be any type of budget program, so for those individuals that need to remain on a budget, they can choose to stick with AEP as the supplier. Mayor William Healy congratulating new Council Members and welcoming all to a new year. This is his 5th year and so far this is the best first meeting of the year he has attended. He is looking forward to a great new year with all Members.
