## OLD BUSINESS (PUBLIC SPEAKS): None

PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Rod Pisani as President of Summit United Neighbors speaking in support of the cameras. While he understands they are for traffic matters he hope that if a major crime would be viewed it would still be addressed. Their neighborhood had previously applied for cameras and were awarded cameras. Wayne Jamison says an article was in the newspaper about the county getting \$14,000,000.00 and that the city was to receive \$7,000,000.00 of that. He is asking what will be done with these funds. Leroy Lynch is concerned that when he spoke on August 27, 2012, the interpreter misunderstood and he was not interpreted correctly. He is frustrated because what he was trying to say is that the missing documents from the Law Department need to be investigated so that the workers can be brought back. Dan Fonte is speaking out against the cameras. These are unconstitutional and play the role of prosecutor, jury and judge. This is no way to generate revenue for the city. He is also having a problem with his water bill. He received an estimated bill and was told by the Water Department never to pay an estimated bill. There are thousands of meters in the city not working correctly and this needs addressed. Harry Murutes is against the traffic cameras. He is concerned about the times when you are waiting to turn left or right and the light changes. Would that be concerned a violation? If there would be a traffic accident and he is waved through, is this a violation? Who will look at the exceptions. Kathy Conde is embarrassed to be a Democrat. The Mayor's mistake with the credit card would be considered a theft in office by many. When is enough, enough. She has lost hope that Council, the Law Department and the Police force do not have what it takes to move this city forward. When elected you all promised to give your best and that should include honesty and integrity. This must be demanded of yourselves and of others. Mervin Rininger says the cameras are a short term solution to a long term problem with the budget. Does the Mayor have any plans to bring in more jobs such as VXI. They need to look at long term solutions to move the city forward. Andrew Procyk states there is a lot of crime n the Gibbs School area and he wants cameras in the area to possibly help with criminals. Pete DiGiacomo is in favor of cameras in school zones to stop speeding and make a little money for the city. He does feel that Council should hold off in the vote until all of the details are worked out in the contract terms. Dan Albett tells all that Redflex is a company that outsources the work. Some Members may have the idea that these may also be used to fight crime but the contract does not permit any use beyond traffic violations. The Mayor has stated that the revenue generated from cameras has been included in the 2013 budget. He stated that there were no public hearings regarding this matter like were held in 2009 so it must be about money and not about safety.

**MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS:** Member West asks since 90 days have past since Phil Sedlacko's contract has been up, what would need done to reinstate an Animal Control officer in the city. He is once again receiving many calls regarding nuisance animals and there is no one to contact. Law Director Martuccio says that Council would need to inform the Safety Director that they would like to have another Animal Control officer and the contracts could be looked into. Member West tells all that a 77 year old woman was chased by a pit bull and had a heart attack and we really need a good contact person. Member Smith thanked all Members of Council for the participation in the 4<sup>th</sup> Ward picnic on September 2<sup>nd</sup>. There was a great turnout. She also wanted to invite everyone to celebrate Peace Day with the schools in Ward 4. She has a schedule of the events throughout the day. Member Morris was very happy to participate in his first Feed the Needy Picnic on Saturday. He was amazed at just how everything came together under the leadership of Member Dougherty with the assistance of Clerk Timberlake. He would like to see some of the teens that need to serve Community Service hours be involved in this in the future. Member Cirelli thanked Member Dougherty and others for another successful Feed the Needy. She is always happy to help in serving the citizens of the city. Member Dougherty appreciates all of the other comments and thanked the Council Members, the Mayor, the city departments, WalMart and many others for their ongoing support. This was the 20th Feed the Needy picnic and it could not go on without everyone's help. The people from Family Time Entertainment have donated their time for the last 13 years and the people enjoy them as well as the meal. They will be retiring and will be hard to replace. There were 500 hamburgers and 400 hot dogs provided on Saturday as well as 92 food bags. Service Director Price addressed the issue with the water meters and the MTU units that send the data to the MDU receivers are not communicating properly. These units are sealed so the batteries can't be replaced. There are about 35 to 40,000 of these and since they were all purchased at the same time, they are all failing now. There will be a form included with the water bill that will allow residents to read their own meter and call it in to the Water Department until these can be corrected or replaced. Member West asked if Mr. Jamison's questions could be answered. Service Director Price is not real sure which dollars Mr. Jamison was discussing but they could be foreclosure money, demolition money or possibly casino dollars. Member Dougherty also stated that thank you letters would be going out to all of the area businesses that helped with the donations that made Feed the Needy a success again this year. Service Director Price said when deciding next years entertainment, Member Dougherty might want to consider the 4 hot young Councilmen and he was surprised to see Member Dougherty, Member Cirelli and Member West line dancing with his wife.
