OLD BUSINESS (PUBLIC SPEAKS): None

PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Monique Davis had previously asked Council to create some programs for youth in the city and now the death toll has increased and still no new programs exist. The youth on the corners that are being run out of town are the shining stars that can save this city because they have a lot of talent. She feels something must be done because her family was safer in a bigger city. Linda Cottrell is a licensed demolition contractor for the city for the last 30 years. She would like to see the bids for the large upcoming demolition project be placed in sealed envelop to insure the integrity of the process. She also feels that the Building Department should award the abatement bids to license contractors because right now the demo contractors subcontract the abatement work out to companies they hire that may or may not have the proper license and may not get the properties completely clean of asbestos. If the Building Department awarded the abatement bids, the liability for both the city and the demo contractors would be removed. She also stated that the demo contractors cannot include the removal of the trees in the power lines because they are not equipped to cut these so that is another thing the city needs to look at in the demolition process. Dick Drake says that trees are natures air conditioners. A person uses about 278 pounds of air per year for breathing and 1 acre of trees covers enough air for 18 people annually. Since the average tree takes about 15 years of growth to give back to the air and water supply we must get this Tree Ordinance in place for our survival. Bruce Nordman walks with Bruce Brewer to canvas the neighborhoods and while the Police Department does an excellent job with the staff they have, more bed space needs to be opened at the jail. Sheriff Swanson and Commissioner Bernabei said that more beds would be opened when the tax passed. It must be frustrating for officers not to be able to put away the individuals that they arrest. He feels that Canton City Council and administration should get together with Massillon and Alliance and put pressure on the county to get these beds opened up. Pete DiGiacomo agrees with Bruce Nordman. The police made a good raid last week in the Newton zone and within 24 hours all of the people that had been arrested were back on the streets since there were no beds to hold them in the County Jail. He spoke with Janet Weir Creighton and she stated that their #1 goal was to reopen those beds because they were aware of the effect on crime this would have. They need to get the staff hired to cover these beds and get 125 to 150 of them back in use. Council needs to lean on the County Commissioners to get this done. Harold Friedman states that 49th Street is a speedway between Carlton and Colonial Club Apartments because there is no stop sign going west. You can't walk the streets because of the speeders and he is afraid to even shovel the apron of his driveway. The city needs to put a three way stop at 49th Street and Vernon NW. Pat Kirk is very thankful for the appointment to the Tree Commission. James Parker thanked Monique Davis for her service but feels her pain. He would like to create the Snoop Bowl for the inner city youth. He also thanked Dick Drake for wanting to put Cherry trees on Cherry Street. He asks how Redflex will deal with the bus cameras in the situations of 4 lane roads. Dominique Simpson says the government is corrupt. While he was sleeping his car was impounded. He says his car was "stolen" by the police at 10:00 am and his ticket was written at 4:30 pm then the court changed his ticket and gave him a new case. Since the government and all the people here are corrupt they are letting people come into the city and be corrupt too. Tara Nelson says on 2/2/13 she came to speak at Council but when she attempted to sign in for Public Speaks there was no sheet available to sign up. She thought she might be too early so she went back after Committee meetings and the sheet had been pulled. Miss Nelson spoke to Majority Leader Dougherty and Clerk Timberlake about this matter but has not heard back any information on their findings and would like all to know that she feels the public voices are very important. She also invited all to a CashMob at the Amvets being done to help promote local small business. Bret Moore appreciates the work being done by all and he seconds the words of Bruce Nordman. He is the SAFE (Safety Acceptance From Everyone) Director for the Neighborhood Association. He made a call to the city to have a speaker at their meeting regarding fire safety and was told that there was no one available to do that. This was amazing to him that there was no one able to speak to citizens on fire safety. He would really like everyone to get busy and make Canton a great city again.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Member Cirelli talks about an ad in The Repository on Sunday from a company in Dover, Ohio that will take street lights, light poles, grave markers, etc for scrap and while she knows there is no control over Dover, can someone please address this. Law Director Martuccio says that the first part of the ad is a public service announcement to advertise for business but if he read it correctly, these are all items that the company would not take for scrap. Member Cirelli then states that she had not had time to read it because it had been given to her by a constituent. Member West is looking at an EEO report for the city from February and it shows 129 African Americans, 1 Asian and 1 Hispanic worker in the total of 804 city employees. This is only 6% so he would like all departments to even out their employees to the community base of the population. Member Cirelli questions the Finance Director on any travel expenses he may receive from the Mayor. Finance Director DiRuzza states that all items from the Mayor is included on the long spreadsheet that Council receives each month but if she is looking for a particular expense, she could let him know. Member Cirelli states that she has been told the Mayor is currently in China and asks who is paying for this trip. Is it business or personal? Are there any Community Development dollars going to fund this trip? Community Development Director Williams says that no CD or CDBG money of any type is being used for this trip. Service Director Price says he is traveling with the group that was formerly named the Summit Mayor's Association but they now have a new name. It is still Mayors from Summit, Portage, Stark and possibly other surrounding counties. Member Cole asks the status of Canton's Animal Control situation or TNR program since there is no longer an Animal Control officer. Member Morris responses by explaining that the TNR group could not get along. They were all fighting like cats and dogs. They did as a committee develop a policy but it was not put into place because of the money. He was told that this could be an amendment to the previous Animal Control contract if it was ever needed. Member Cole asked then if the city would just remain without animal control. Safety Director Ream did state at this time there would not be an Animal Control officer. Law Director Martuccio states the figures provided by Member West for the African Americans actually calculates out to 16% not 6% but that he agrees that is low. With some of the positions that have people retiring, they have been looking at filling Police and Fire with more diverse employees. The administration and Human Resources department continues to look for recruitments for minorities in all positions. President Schulman says that only 2 legislators responded to the invitation and neither of them were available for tonight's meeting. A small group will be meeting with Representative Slesnick and Senator Oelslager later in the month. He commended the Clerk and staff for always doing a good job. Member West asked the Clerk to report on her findings for Miss Nelson. Clerk Timberlake stated that the tape had been reviewed the very next day and it was found that the Public Speaks sign up sheet had been on the counter during the entire time and had been pulled at the correct time to begin the Council meeting. This information had not been provided to her because she had not attended a meeting since that time. Member Smith thanked all for the well wishes during the passing of her niece. She also thanked Members Dougherty and Babcock along with the Clerk for bringing food to her home.
