Also advised that there was a fire at Ridgewood Castle today; Law Director Martuccio re: Advised that the retire/rehire case has been appealed. Also advised that an amendment can be drawn up to have the President of Council added to the Ordinance to change his terms as well from two to four years; Member West re: Advised Mrs. Ramsey that Harrisburg is his #1 pick for the Ward 2 paving priority.
