PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Pat Kirk is delighted that Canton now has a Tree Commission. All meetings are open to the public and she encourages people to attend. The next meeting is tomorrow evening at the Garden Center. Martin Zawacky is here for Harrison Hills and the folks on Trinity Place. He feels something proactive needs to be done and is asking the city leaders to tell them how they can help with these problems. Scott Knies lives across the street from Ridgewood Castle. There are many pit bulls and mastiffs and other dogs that he feels do not belong in apartments. He and his dog were attacked by a pit bull and this should never happen in a residential neighborhood. Dr. James King asked for support in the passage of the honorary naming of "Ralph Nay Way" on 2nd Street S after his grandfather. He was one of the founders of Canton Bulldogs and met with the others to create the football league. Roger Zachary thanked everyone for the completion of the project to prevent flooding in the Georgeview Estates. He appreciated all of the work from the various department heads and the fact that they listened to his needs and treated him with respect. Robert Hamilton thanked the city government for the innovative ideas that are coming out to help with the problems on Trinity Place NW. Carissa Kerestes was on her porch talking with the Mayor when a kid came up the street and ran through the stop sign. She was glad he got to witness the things she sees everyday and is afraid that when the cruisers leave, it will all be the same again. John Kerestes is glad the Mayor stepped forward and put his foot down with the drivers on their streets. If we don't have a police force or Fire Department to help us, what can we do. Douglas Vickers says thanks for everything that is going on but there is still more to be done. He would like another light put on Trinity Place NW so that the entire street is lit up. Nicole Vickers also wanted to thank everyone and asked if the speed limit could be painted on the street like is done on the interstates. Pete DiGiacomo says that the duck feces is so bad on the bike trails in the park, you cannot even ride on them. He congratulated the city for receiving an additional \$700,000.00 and he would like to see this used to hire more safety forces. John Neal Honaberger gave a big thank you to Council and the Mayor for helping on Trinity Place. Bruce Nordman says that Group 175 has canvassed many homes in the last couple of weeks and claims that many people want to put their homes up for sale because of the crime in the city. There are many causes being funded but no change in funding for the safety forces in the city. He wants money transferred in the General Fund to hire more officers immediately. He would also like to recognize Bob Harper for an excellent job with the 4th of July fireworks display. Lois DiGiacomo is with Coming Together Stark County. This organization was founded for diversity and is still one of the best kept secrets around. This Thursday, July 18, 2013 there will be a re-launching of the program at 6:00pm at Cork and Canvas on 3rd Street and she asks all to attend. James Parker says that Esther Hay and Jim King are very delighted that the Resolution passed. It is time to honor some of the pioneers of football. MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Member Griffin discussed the regional and national softball tournaments that are now being held at Willig Field. This field is a jewel and word is spreading that this is a great place for National tournaments. There will be a mens tournament of over 65 teams that will be here over Labor Day weekend. The Canton ASA and the Recreation Department are becoming recognized and this is something to be proud of. Member Fisher thanked the Mayor, Chief Lawver and Director Barton for speaking at his recent town hall meeting. There was a very good turn out and they explained a lot about the city's newest technology to his constituents. Mayor Healy says tonight was a different type of meeting because some people came out with thanks and it is nice to hear when the city accomplishes things. Law Director Martuccio states that sometimes state government can be a double edge sword and removing pit bulls from the vicious animal list may be one of them. The city officials are meeting with the owners of Ridgewood Castle again next week and will add this to the discussion list. Canton does ask firefighters and EMS from other cities to help out in certain situations but we also send help back to these areas as well when they need it. Member Cirelli asks if a mediator will be brought in regarding the issues with the Mayor on Trinity Place NW. Law Director Martuccio says there are other cities that we look into matters for without charge and we are now asking another city to look at this for us. President Schulman says the state sales tax is increasing because Governor Kasich raised this with the state budget. He eliminated real estate credits and rollback used by many in an effort to break the middle class. There is a \$2,000,000,000.000 surplus at the state level and still tax breaks to the wealthy while items like sales tax slide under the radar. Member Smith thanked all Members of Council for voting for Resolution 36 in her absence. She also was thankful that not one house had flooding in Georgeview Estates during the recent storms since this project was completed.
