She congratulated and thanked all Members of Council for participating and helping during this event. She also thanked Member Morris for saving 2 cats and the issue of how to handle animals in an evacuation is something that the city needs to look at and make plans for. Becky Murphy gave compliments to the response of all during the chemical spill last week. She would like to know why there are hazmat materials sitting in abandon buildings for over 2 years and how many more buildings are like this in the city. She would like the city to make it a priority to inspect these vacant businesses before there is a serious disaster. John Laughlin has questions about the demolition of Washington School. Is this going to come down with the matching funds the city has received from the state? He asks why the city would use these monies on a building that belongs to Canton City Schools when the same amount could be used for 40 or 50 more homes. Vera Rippert has a business across the street from the Canton Friendship Center and she has experienced problems with the patrons from there. She did have her windows smashed by a man that was upset with his caseworker. She feels it is a scary situation and a major nuisance to the neighborhood. She would like to see the Friendship Center moved.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Member Morris says the safety forces went way above and beyond at the chemical spill last week. Member Morris thanked Leader Dougherty and Member Smith for stepping up to the plate and helping set up everything at the Civic Center which was a home run for the citizens in need. There needed to be just a little more communication out to the public about the evacuation and he was wondering if perhaps the tornado sirens could be used if needed in the future. He gave compliments to everyone involved as they all made him look great in Ward 9. Member West announced that the Ohio Legislative Black Caucus would be holding a Town Hall meeting here in the Chamber on Thursday, September 26th at 4:00 PM. This is open to the public so come down and ask any questions you have of the state members. He thanked Napoli's, Walgreen's and Sport's Therapy for their donations of food and water to the people evacuated to the Civic Center last week. Member West discussed the Peace Rally that was held at McKinley High School on Saturday where 2,000 people came together and had a great dialog regarding peace and unity in the city. He thanked all Members of Council for really being out there and serving in the community over the past couple of weeks. Member Smith also commended businesses and people who helped out at the Civic Center including the Clerk of Council who came down to deliver pizza. She thanked Viola Fisher for hanging in there and staying the night with her to help those in need. Member Fisher thanked all Council Members and administration for their help last Monday. Member Cirelli spoke with Director Barton about the reverse 9-1-1 calls during the evacuation and only about 40 to 50% of the public still has land lines and received these calls. The city needs to find a way to address all citizens in an emergency. She also would like to see about the vacant buildings being inspected to prevent any problems in the future. She was one of the founding members of the Canton Friendship Center and she feels that they have lost their mission. Member Cirelli knows that this location is not a good fit for the clients of the Center or the residents of the neighborhood so she has been working with Director Williams on possible solutions. Member Mariol has had several conversations with the Director of the Friendship Center and he and Director Williams have been showing them other buildings that may be available for them to relocate to. Member Dougherty says that someone has now been arrested for the murder of Bennie Angelo and that is a good thing for the family. Officer Vic George did not give up. He spoke on the 21st Annual Feed the

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Needy picnic which was held this past Saturday. It was another packed house even in the rain. Giant Eagle on 30th Street has really become a great part of this event over the past 2 years and their volunteers were here from the beginning to the end. He thanked all Members of Council and the Administration for the generous help of both money and efforts. This event would not happen with out the help of everyone.
