MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Member West: Thanked Mike Rorar and Serv Dir Bartos for a great job filling in the potholes this past Saturday. He complimented Mike for having a proactive approach. Serv Dir Bartos: Stated most of the credit goes to Mike & Central Allied as Mike reached out to Central Allied to work in conjunction with his 6 crews and 18 workers whereas Central Allied remained open so the crews could get the asphalt needed to patch the holes. The crews used 50 tons of asphalt which was about 100,000 lbs of asphalt shoveled by hand. He thanked the residents as the crews stated that they felt like rock stars with the residents coming out & thanking them for patching. Serv Dir. Bartos referenced other emergency procedures that were being handled,12th from Gibbs to Cleveland and 25th St. NW. He referenced the snow plows that are in terrible shape & the City needs 5 replaced immediately. Member Hawk: Suggested that on the 12th St. Project since they are already going to mill it, go further west to fix that area & combine the two. Serv Dir. Bartos: Stated that due to 25th St. not having anything under the pavement is why that area needs re-paved & 12th St is being milled because it has brick underneath. Member-At-Large Hart: Mentioned the area he lives Arnold & McGregor has bricks underneath & it would be cost effective to strip the asphalt & keep the brick streets. Council Member West: Asked Serv Dir Bartos, since we have had such a tough winter are they (Street Dept) going to re-score the roads. Serv Dir. Bartos: Replied they are going to go back & look & re-evaluate but would most definitely look into it. Law Dir Martuccio: Addressed the students who came from Jackson & Central Catholic that there was in fact a lot of work, research, & commitment that went into the great detail of work done before they got to the meeting. He referenced the many amendments & commended Council, Cindy, & Purchasing & thanked everyone for their patience. He referenced concerns from the public speakers & informed Mr. DiGiacomo that there are significant restrictions put on private plowers in which they are not allowed to put any snow on public streets or in driveways the drivers will in fact be ticketed / fined for doing that. He referenced Ms. Campbell's concern of her auto accident stating that under Ohio Law, the City is immune from claims. He stated the City only has so many trucks, so many plows, & as in other areas of the country, we experienced a shortage of salt. He stated there was a limited amount of immunity. The General Assembly shifts the burden in which lets you be free from lawsuits when an uninsured driver is involved and that is why it is up to the insured's insurance carrier to cover that. He also mentioned that with the snow ordinances, they are not going to go out and arrest frail grandmas & we will be looking at & will be amending these specific archaic ordinances. President Schulman: Referenced the Wisconsin issue currently going on whereas the Wisconsin Republican Governor took away their rights where there is a minimum and maximum wage with no negotiation benefits so not collectively bargained.
