OLD BUSINESS (PUBLIC SPEAKS): Reviewed Pending Issues from Public Speaks

PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Jim Adams (Health Commissioner): Speaking on behalf of the Board of Health with regards to the conditions of the Sears Building. The Health Dept. has occupied the Sears building since 1993. At that time there were plans to expand to renovate, and occupy the 2nd floor. This was never completed. In 1993, 3 studies were done regarding the combining of the City and County Health Departments. The ruling was that there would be no combination of the 2 Departments. Currently the 2nd floor is occupied with junk and trash. The WIC Clinic had over 12,000 clients last year so they had to hire more personnel. The office that the Dietician uses is no larger than a closet. They currently have leaking windows, inadequate ventilation for heating and cooling, mold and access issues. The facade is falling off the building onto the sidewalks. They are identifying all the needs and have selected an architect. They are currently working within the SID District. Pete DiGiacomo: There was an arson fire on 6th and Marion. The church burned to the ground. The Repository printed that it was a hate crime and that bothers me. It was an abandoned building, and was beyond repair. It would have cost more to heat the building than what the building was worth. When he called the city he was told that it was not on the list to come down. He is working with Derek on kayaking in the city parks and would like to invite council members to come. Bruce Nordman: Mission of 175 is to get the staffing of both police and fire departments to 175. There are 6 police and 3 firemen scheduled to retire according to Safety Dir Perry. Saf Dir Perry stated that she would speak with the Chiefs of both departments to get a more accurate number for replacement. He oversaw troops in the military and always kept an eye on retirements for staffing. A City of this size should be aware of staffing level for safety and lock in a sufficient number for protection. He will receive information about funding for Moving Ohio Forward. Bob Knight: Speaking concerning pit bulls and dog bites. Was bitten last August by 2 of the neighbors pit bulls. If we are not going to enforce Ordinance Section 505.18, we should strike it from the Ordinance.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Member Hawk: The dogs that Mr. Knight spoke about are not chained or cared for like they should be. Animal control is needed. Member Morris: Has the State of Ohio removed pit bulls from the vicious animal list? If so, how does this affect our city ordinance and enforcement? Law Director Martuccio: Yes, pit bulls were taken off the vicious animal list. This law was being used to sue people if they were bitten. The law can't be enforced in the City because the State trumps us. There will be talk about updating this ordinance but people can still be held accountable in a civil court, just as with any other dog. Member West: Received a call from a citizen that had been trapped by a racoon. Phil Sedlacko once again stepped up to help the community. We need to restore our animal nuisance office. Saf. Dir. Perry thanked Members Mariol, Smith, and West for attending the Stark County Partnership for Safer Community conference. They talked about violence in the community and about ways to address the issues. Law Dir. Martuccio: This was a historic event in that over 300 people, all across the community, attended. This was an awesome event and a precedent was set. Prayer is permitted at Council Meetings. Court ruled 5-4 that prayer is allowed. Constituents can speak with their Councilman and request that a certain prayer or religion be acknowledge, but it is up to that Council Member if they choose to do so. Speakers or prayers from other paths are allowed. Member Mariol: Thanked Saf. Dir. Perry, Members Smith and West for their help at the event. Pastor Moss is over program CIRV. This program works. City and Council need to get behind the program. Murders went from 16 to 2 when CIRV was previously in place. Member Hart: Out by the Gregory Galvanizing Plant on Cleveland Ave. S. and watched a crew throwing down asphalt without rolling it. Had a staff member contact the Street Department. The information received was that not all trucks are equipped with rollers, cars can pack it down, and guys are tired after rolling. If we're not going to do it correctly the first time, maybe we shouldn't do it at all. Money is being wasted. Some guys are taking the time to roll it and some are not. If there is a procedure, it needs to be enforced. Member Mariol: There will be a CIRV meeting with Pastor Moss on Thursday, May 15 at 6:00 p.m. at Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church, 821 O'Jays Parkway.
