OLD BUSINESS (PUBLIC SPEAKS): Reviewed Pending Issues from Public Speaks

PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Steve Silver - Thomas West made a proposal to hire an animal control officer with regards to wild and vicious animals. He and Frank Morris were going to come up with a police with a basis of humane and compassionate treatment for the animals and people. According to Frank Morris, the policy was not instituted because there was no animal control officer. I am requesting Council look into a policy. Every animal has rights to live. I ask that you research effective grants. Dayton, Ohio received \$100,000.00 grant. Bill Dieffenbaugher - Works for the St. Dept. Wants to give an update on potholes. Since April 28 we have put down 509 more tons of asphalt. All hand shoveled. We've clocked 1500 hours of overtime. We had 28 workers when I gave the last update, now we have 26. 2 more workers bid out. The average age was 50, now it's 53. One of the guys who left was 27 years old. The Chip & Seal works pretty well, Crack & Seal went by the wayside. If you drive by the O'Jays Parkway, there are cracks down the middle of the road from Mahoning to 4th St. If Crack & Seal would have been used, it wouldn't have happened. Also want to thank Member Dougherty, Member Babcock and our Clerk, Cindy Timberlake for bringing us dinner to the Street Department. Greg Sanford - Problems in neighborhood. I live at 1537, my neighbor lives at 1539. I am between 2 slumlord properties. One was condemned but is still being rented out. It has bedbugs. They throw stuff on the street. 1533 used to have squatters. They kept pit bulls in the house and never let them out to use the bathroom. The stench is so bad. There are cockroaches. It's time the landlords do their job. We're being forced out, having to put a lot of money into our houses. We can't spray for bedbugs. The cost of removing bedbugs is over \$10,000.00. President Schulman - Mr. Sanford, do you have the names of the landlords? Mr. Sanford - No, just addresses. Pete DiGiacomo - We had an arson fire on 6th & Marion. The church burned down. Well, it wasn't a church anymore, but the empty building burned down. Excavator is gone but the remains are still piled up. I made a suggestion a little while ago about a gold mine. On 77 Northbound, put radars out. I came south from Akron/Canton Airport and counted 4 Sheriffs and 3 Highway Patrol handing out tickets. None of our police were out there. That could be a way to bring thousands of dollars into the city. Patrick Barton: On the tax credit it was pointed out that you're penalizing people who live here and work outside the city. Me and my wife work outside the city but felt we should pay back to the city we live in. People receiving 100% credit because they're working in Akron. I still feel they should pay something. We went to get out taxes done and the tax rate had changed. I asked my tax preparer if this was common and he said he didn't know many that don't change. I don't agree that people will be forced to move. The cost of living is lower here. We used to say vote your conscious. If you agree that it is worth getting rid of your funding source, vote your conscious. Carol Metz - Thanks to the city for SWAT hitting the Maple Ave area. It was a drug house. The drugs were gone. They've hit a couple of times. Once no one was home. Somehow the son knows when SWAT is coming. No one at the home works but the mother, but no one was home. They didn't get the dealer. I believe he's getting inside information from somewhere. My second issue is the property with the chemical fire. Mr. Tricket's. We can still smell fumes. We all have sinus problems when it rains or gets damp. He owes tons of money on back taxes. He went down and paid \$75.00 and now we can't do anything. Trash: Mr. Keefer owns the company. He was supposed to come in here with me. Heavy trucks keep driving down our neighborhood. Robert Tabor - I live In the same neighborhood where the chemical fire was. We have children out there playing. We were sent a form in November that it was coming down, but it hasn't come down yet. The semi trucks, they're tearing up our roads. The line of semis is 70 - 80 trucks long. The neighbor has a large rock in her yard, a truck moved the rock (passed pictures around showing torn up roads). We can't get to our property. They're there everyday. I have a case involving zoning. I'm being punished by Mr. Morris. Judge Kubilus ordered me to come down here.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Member Fisher - Regarding the trucks, Service Director Bartos requested that we try to start a process regarding commercial truck traffic to reduce wear and tear on the roads. Member West: Are there any laws on the books that deal with trucks in residential areas? Law Director Martuccio - There are laws with regards to weight limits but I will have to look into it. Member West - I also wanted to follow up about the Animal Control Officer. On 6/3/13 there was an Informal Resolution passed. I requested Animal Nuisance Contract to pick up animals other than cats. I still want an Animal Control Officer. I receive calls in the middle of the night on weekends about racoons, dogs. I had to call on Cindy to see who we were using. My constituents had to pay someone to come out. We should have an officer. Cats are another issue. Feral cats are another issue. Since Phil Sedlacko stepped down, he's been helping for free. We need to have another officer and I will continue to advocate. Member Fisher - I also called Sedlacko last week. He helped, and continues to help. I echo Mr. West. We had 4 cats and a possum. That doesn't sounds like city living. Member Hart - Thanks to Terri Ross on the 8th Floor. 8 baby ducklings fell down the sewer. The mother was flying around. The guys from Collections came down. One guy stayed in the sewer until he got the last one out. Member West - Congratulations to Viola Fisher, she graduated from college. Member Smuckler - If anyone needs to get rid of snakes, Fonda is an expert. Member Morris - Successful SWAT raid in the 2100 block of Maple. It has slowed traffic down, not as many drug buys. Mr. Tabor, I wasn't aware that I was punishing you. Your zoning request was turned down but I wasn't aware that I was punishing you, but I will apologize. I spoke with Mr. Keefer outside, he will try to resolve the truck issue. He didn't know the trucks were driving down the neighborhood streets. Safety Director, is there an update on Convey? Safety Director Perry - Not sure, will defer to Law Director Martuccio. Law Director Martuccio - Where is that? Member Morris - Convey Containers, the chemical fire. Law Director Martuccio - I don't have an update but will check with Assistant Law Director. Service Director Bartos - The Mowing Program, we have 3100 lots, we can do 3 mows per lot, 1 mow in a 2 month period. On the Mahoning Road bids, we got 2 good bids. The 1st was \$500,000 under engineers estimate. The second was slightly under, but not 10%. Central Allied entered good bids, so we have a back up in case we need it. Northstar has been helping patch 12th St. Crews are all over the city. Member Hawk: Conneaut they found people to mow. Can I get 6 in my ward? Member West - How many lots per ward? Service Dir Bartos: Properties are reported in the email that's sent. Sam Sliman called Sen. Oelslager and Schuring about additional funding for 12th St. Senator Schuring returned the call immediately and will look into it.
