OLD BUSINESS (PUBLIC SPEAKS): Reviewed Pending Issues from Public Speaks

PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Pete DiGiacomo spoke about the shooting that recently took place and mentioned that most of these guys have extensive criminal records. He stated that the police officers are doing their jobs, only to have the criminals released after posting \$25.00 bonds. He said that parking tickets cost more than \$25.00. Dan Moeglin first apologized to the Service Director, Mayor Healy, Deputy Mayor Williams, and Council for the issue with 55th St. He stated that he was caught off guard by the extent of the Change Order and stated that they will do their best to insure that it does happen again and will improve communication with everyone while working on their construction projects. He stated that he just received a Certificate of Recognition for the City's energy efficiency project applications completed in 2003. He showed the certificate to Council and read the letter. Leon Cote stated that for the last dozen years he has attended the weekly Council meetings, only to hear the same complaints about the city streets not being paved until late October or November. He said that when they're paved this late, they start to crumble within a year or so. He is looking for accountability and wanted to know who is dropping the ball. He mentioned that this past Saturday, a crew from Central Allied paved Field Ave. NW while it was 38 degrees out. The road had been scraped down over two weeks ago. Four men were out again on Sunday. He stated that without curbs or gutters, the road doesn't look good and wanted to know if blacktop curbs should be installed when paving a road with no curb. He also had a list of questions that he wanted answered and passed around a hand-out with those questions. James Parker spoke about the history of the McKinley/Massillon football game and mentioned that instead of speaking about the game and the history, a certain Councilman was out humiliating the Mayor. He also stated that a Councilman parks in the handicapped section and maybe should receive a parking ticket in order to be stopped. He also stated that he believes the Mayor works extremely hard, unlike Council. He suggested that Council read the CZB report that was paid for. He mentioned that some people still put money in the parking meter after 4:00 p.m. and on weekends, and stated that it should be publicized that it is not necessary. He also mentioned that he has been told that the city of Akron has eliminated metered parking and suggested that the Akron Mayor has more influence over Akron's Council. Henry Preston spoke about the money that the city of Canton had received to fund the new bike trails that will start at Cleveland Ave. He mentioned that many of the current bike lanes are of poor design and construction. He believes that they are unsafe because they cause vehicle lane traffic to weave in and out of marked lanes. The Northbound bike lanes have bramble, grass, nails, thumbtacks and other debris because the grading of the road directs more water and debris to certain sides of the road and it's infrequently cleaned. He also believes that there is no separation or physical protection between the bike lanes and traffic on Walnut. He has noticed that the cyclists use the sidewalks and not the poorly designed bike lanes. He believes that prudent planning of the bike lanes could have resulted in protected or buffered bike lanes.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Member Hart mentioned that the President of City Council made a comment on the car he was driving and that he was totally shocked to see the Council President driving an all electric Tesla. He thanked the President for a great looking car and for being environmentally conscious. Mayor Healy spoke in reference to Pete DiGiacomo's comments about the Police Department making arrests and for \$25.00 the criminals are back on the streets. He mentioned that it is a real issue. He mentioned that the Police Department is doing a fantastic job in prevention and addressing issues after the fact. He mentioned that an individual who was killed at the Marathon shooting had recently been released from serving only less than 2 years on a prior homicide. He stated that we have a serious issue involving our Court system; not enough space, not enough evidence, and early releases. He stated that there doesn't seem to be any deterrents and as a society we need to look at every facet of our safety system. Member Dougherty spoke about a Veteran's event that they had on Saturday in Ward 6. A new sign was put up in the Memorial Garden Park on Mahoning Rd. He wanted to thank the Police and Fire Departments for their donation and for their presence that day. He also thanked the Mayor, Member Babcock and the Clerk of Council for their attendance. He wished the Veterans a nice day tomorrow and asked for a show of hands of the Veterans in attendance. Member Hawk mentioned Mr. Parker's comments and stated that he should spend as much time getting his stats correct as he does on his vocabulary and it would be a better world. He also stated that in honor of our Veterans, he had a very fine uncle who was a POW of World War II, who was severely wounded and eligible for 100% disability but refused to take it because he thought he was never 100% disabled. He also firmly rejected a handicapped parking placard for years because he thought someone else might need it more. President Schulman wished the Veterans the best and thanked them for their service to the Country. He also mentioned that House Bill 5 has been removed from Senator Oelslager's Finance Committee and now is in the hands of the Ways and Means Committee and it is sure to pass. He said that as an individual working in Canton, having a law office, he could probably manufacture losses in a certain year and be able to carry forward those losses for 5 years into the future, potentially never paying another dime to the City of Canton, in taxes. Any company could do this. If you work out of town, you may never have to pay another dime to the city that you live in. He stated that this bill is draconian, and that it starves and chokes cities to make it so punitive for citizens living in cities that they will be forced to join forces with surrounding areas.
