OLD BUSINESS (PUBLIC SPEAKS): None

PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Sheldon Arkow spoke about flooding on Schuller Ave. NE and what to do with the flood waters. He said this is his 4th trip to City Council. His first 2 times no one believed him, the next time something was done, but it was done wrong and there is a worse situation now. There was just a flood that cost him \$46,000.00, out of his own pocket. Both Geico and Progressive Insurance wouldn't pay, claiming it was an act of God. He has his own sump with an electric pump to pump out his back yard. His neighbors don't have a sump, consequently his pump can't keep up with all of the water. He feels that the City is spending their money on other things than the neighborhoods, such as the Hall of Fame and street paving, while he and his neighbors are suffering. He submitted a petition signed by 70 of his neighbors. There's a lady that has had to have her basement redone twice in 2 years. He and his senior neighbors can't afford to keep going like this and need help from the City. He suggested putting a big sewer behind their houses. There used to be a creek but the developer was allowed to fill the creek in and sell the lots. The water now has nowhere to go except in their backyards, which eventually gets in their basement. The Collections Dept. has been terrific. They were there last week looking for reasons the existing sewers can't carry the water. They're just not big enough. He saw an article in the newspaper where the County is buying meteorology to allow them to know when the Nimishillen Creek is rising. He wants to know what good it's going to do to know when the creek is rising when all you can do is go up on your roof. Pastor Walter Moss, CIRV President, gave a short report on their ability to help reduce the gang violence in Stark County. On Friday, July 31st, between 3:30 - 5:00 p.m. they did a "Boots on the Ground" in the Gibbs area. The Canton Police Department sent 3 Community Officers, Scott Jones, Scott Dillinger, and Judy Solly. He stated that there was no media there to witness white Police Officers and African Americans converse with no one feeling threatened, just people talking. An Officer offered to help a lady figure out who owns a lot that she's interested in. He stated he saw some walls break down with the officers and the people. He stated that since the project has been in place, last October, the GMA group member involvement, there has been no murder of a gang member shooting and killing another gang member. There have been drug related shootings, but no gang member shootings. If this holds true, then CIRV is doing what they're supposed to do, dropping gang violence and the number of gang on gang murders. Henry Preston stated that for the last 60 days he's had a great opportunity to learn about the outstanding employees of the City of Canton. He had a flim-flam scam contractor and Mr. Molnar from the Building Department spent over an hour of his time telling him what he can do as a resident of Canton. He learned that there are lots of people who operate in the city of Canton without a license or a permit. He asked how many permits had been pulled on his property and found that there was only 1, that went back to 2003. He spent time in the Law Department where an intern, Christy, did a fantastic job taking notes, Jason quarter-backed by having a chat with the contractor and Joe Martuccio gave him some wisdom so they could all play on the same team and they all knew their parts. He felt like he had the A-Team on his side.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Members Smuckler, Mack, Hart, Morris, and Mayor Healy spoke to Mr. Arkow's issue regarding the flooding and drainage issues on Schuller Drive NE. Member West stated that Member Hawk has the best corned beef in town. He also talked about HOF festivities and commended the Administration, Chamber and HOF personnel on a wonderful job. Member West also stated that he believes an animal nuisance officer is still needed and would like Council and the Administration to get together and figure this out. Member West talked about the NIP, CDBG, and Demolition lists. He says if something isn't funded there should still be a Demolition List. Deputy Mayor Williams states that what's been created is a Nuisance Property List. That list is an ongoing list. Properties are transferred from the Nuisance Property List to the Demo List when there is money to fund the demolition. This was done because of the numerous complaints by Council asking why there's a demolition if there's no money to tear the property down. It gave a false representation so the change was made over a year ago. They send those updated lists to Council every Friday. Member West stated that he does not receive the Nuisance List, so Deputy Mayor Williams told him he would have one in the morning. Member Hawk stated that Legislation was passed a few years ago that required people to post a bond if they were interested in purchasing a property. They were able to get only one 30-day extension, if not, the bond was revoked and the house was torn down with the posted bond money. The Landlord Association found a loophole and now they're able to go to Court and get a stay and not post a bond. We need to make sure the stays are limited and force people to post that bond, rehabilitate the house, or we drop it. Mayor Healy thanked Member West for recognizing the City employees. He says the HOF was a great experience this year and that it was the most spectacular event. Member Hart spoke about his trip to Ireland and believes that the City is behind on solar energy. He also feels that the City needs look abroad for visitors to the City because the people in Ireland had never heard about the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
