MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Member West asked Law Director Martuccio how much money from the traffic citations written by the Ohio State Patrol Officers goes into the General Fund. Law Director Martuccio stated that he wasn't sure precisely, but as a rule, when the State writes the tickets, the money goes to the State. He believes there is something that the local Court can retain for processing the case. Member Fisher reminded Council that a few weeks back they passed an Informal Resolution urging the United States Treasury to reject a proposed cut to some retired Teamsters allocation of the Central States Pension Fund. He announced that the Treasury rejected the proposed cuts proposed by Central States. It's not the final answer but it does prevent the immediate reduction of 35%. He also mentioned that it was 4 years ago that Member Mariol was appointed by the Democratic Central Committee. Member Harmon explained that he refused to hold a Committee Meeting on the issue of the sewer rate in 1st Reading because the City Administration's very detailed, lengthy presentation was held 5 weeks ago regarding the increase and they knew that there was only 45 days to repeal it. He doesn't know why they waited until the 11th hour to bring it to a vote, which he doesn't feel comfortable doing. He believes there is a lot to consider and deliberate on and doesn't want to rely on his memory to cast a vote. He also took notice that the Water Superintendent, Tracy Mills was not in attendance to answer any questions. Member Harmon also answered Member West's questions regarding money collected for citations written by the State Highway Patrol. He stated that only court costs are kept by the city. The County gets 45%, the State gets 45%, the remaining goes to the Stark County Law Library. If a city officer writes a ticket, 100% goes to the City, but not of the money all into the General Fund. The Court has some specialized funds that some goes into. The percentage going into the General Fund varies by violation. President Pro Tem Morris stated that the sponsors of the sewer rate legislation did not sit on it. The Communication was sent to the Law Department of April 19th. The Law Director then sent an email on April 20th, which he responded to; however the Communication didn't come down until two weeks later. He feels that over 400 days in the Sewer Department's reserve fund is plenty of money and the residents are taxed hard enough. Council had no say in an 8% water increase, but they can push the sewer rate to a vote. That's an 11% increase on the resident's public utilities. That's why he and Member Fisher brought the Communication down, because it's something that can be put before a vote. Taxpayers got stuck with an 8% water increase, he didn't want them to get stuck with another 3% on the sewer bill. He was shocked that it took the Ordinance so long to come down from the Law Department, but it's not uncommon for him, as the Majority Leader to let things get passed on 1st Reading; however he will use some discretion from now on be maybe Council does need to talk things over a little more often. Member Harmon stated that he is also a resident, and although he doesn't like anybody's bill going up, including his, he also doesn't like having to vote on something on the last possible day. Law Director Martuccio stated that although he has been slow to act on some things, he did inform the sponsors that there was an automatic 45 day period where Council has to act, and normally it's done by way of Informal Resolution. The Committee Chair would hold a meeting and through an Informal Resolution would say yes or no. He explained this could also be done by a Communication but left that up to the sponsors. He also let them know what could be included in the Communication. He's not sure this is one of those times when he acted slowly. There are now two things that can happen and one is an Amendment to the Codified Ordinance, pursuant to the Chairman's suggestion if Council wants that "automatic" clause to be amended. Member West wanted to know the affect of the 3%. President Pro Tem Morris stated that if it's not passed there is a 3% increase in the sewer rate, which will most likely go into effect because it needed to be done by Sunday. Council will no longer be able to take action on it, coming up a day short.
