PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Pete DiGiacomo was impressed by the amount of people from various Neighborhood Associations that came down to the Council meeting, but admonished them to come every week, not just once a month, if they really want to make a difference. Linda Campbell was happy to meet her new Ward 2 Council Member, Nate Chester. She's concerned about the condition of her neighborhood with regard to the unsightly curbs and tree limbs falling. These issues are especially troublesome at vacant properties. Kathryn Ramsey thanked Member Morris for his efforts to make Canton clean again. She asked how the littler ordinance would be enforced. She also expressed her concerns about drivers speeding down 16th, from Mahoning to Harrisburg and how drivers park right under stop signs at the 4-way stop at 19th & Superior NE. Chris Leach doesn't think most of the snow plows that he sees in the city are safe. He believes that there should be a some sort of regulation requiring a yearly safety check, certification, and a designation on the windshield for those who pass inspection. Brenda Baylor continued to voice her concerns about the conditions at Republic Steel. She wanted to know when there will be ground resting of the areas surrounding Republic Steel and if there were any samples taken of the buildings at Republic Steel. Pat Silagy-Wesson gave information on the Neighborhood Leadership Council which represents most of the 15 neighborhood associations in the city. She also acknowledged the great leadership of Marilyn Thomas Jones. Martin Zawacky thanked Council for the litter concept and for having it enforced. He thinks the city needs to focus more on quality of life things. He also thanked the members of a neighborhood association for helping to find a Greyhound dog that had run away. He spoke about the work that neighborhood associations do, including razing houses. The last one his neighborhood association did was extremely bad but Member Mariol put the pressure on to help get it down. They continue to maintain property in their neighborhood that belongs to the city, state, and railroad. He said AEP is coming through to put their poles in where they've been maintaining cleanup and he would like Council to ask AEP to put things back as they were so their neighborhood can continue the work they've been doing.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Member Morris spoke about the litter ordinance. He said he has received a lot of credit for not really doing much. All they did was raise the fee an additional \$50.00 to draw attention to it. Chief Lawver promised to put some foot patrols on this, the City Engineer is working on some signs, and he and a few other Council Members are going to work on a city-wide clean up. He believes they can draw more attention to it and shame people into picking up their garbage. He thanked the Repository for helping to draw attention to the issue and will be excited to hear from the Police and the Safety Director about violations. He also encouraged Mrs. Ramsey to contact him if there continues to be trash blowing through the neighborhood so he can alert the Health Department. Mrs. Ramsey listed the items that she had to pick up. Service Director Bartos said it's failed to be mentioned that the city does a lot of things internally in regards to litter control. The Street Dept. continues to do the "Beautify Neighborhoods" clean-ups along with the neighborhood associations. Many are scheduled for this year but there may be a couple dates still available if any neighborhood association wants to contact the Street Dept. to schedule. Community Service and the Courts have been very helpful in clean-up of the vacant lots, mowing, and clean-up of the right of way areas. The Sheriff's Dept. was out on 77 with inmates doing clean up. ODOT was at the regional department head meeting, and committed to being on both Route 30 and Route 62, doing litter clean up as well. Deputy Mayor Williams is working on an initiative with the Department of Development to re-launch and modify a program in which they give out grants to neighborhood associations as well as summer youth employment. They're proposing that on every Friday, the summer youth workers will work with various neighborhood associations to learn the importance of cleaning your neighborhood to improve your quality of life. They hope to have the young people on the payroll by the 2nd week of May. The dates that the neighborhood associations are currently conducting clean-up is every Monday at 10:00 a.m. There are 7 - 9 dates filled, but they always have room for more. On Mondays, they would like to have the Street Dept. and various department heads work with the neighborhood associations and then have the young people on Friday. He believes this is a shared responsibility. Member Smith thanked the neighborhood associations, especially the 4th Ward Association, for all they do. She thanked the 4th Ward Neighborhood Association, Safety Director Perry, Deputy Mayor Williams, and At-Large Members Babcock and Smuckler for coming to the 4th Ward Town Hall Meeting. A neighborhood association member stated that they're tired of picking up trash which comes into their neighborhood from the fast food restaurants within the city and thinks that if the city partners with them, it could be stopped. Member Morris stated that the Repository neglected to publish a comment that he made during an interview. They asked if the litter problem was city-wide and he said yes, it is a city-wide problem; however, hats off to the neighborhood associations for picking up other people's garbage. Clerk Dougherty gave the quote of the week: "Hard times don't create heroes, it is during the hard times when the hero within us is revealed."
