OLD BUSINESS (PUBLIC SPEAKS): None

PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Skylark Bruce, Erik Resnick, Anthony Parker and Joe Fisher spoke about the current racial issues in the city following the protests held over the weekend. Ms. Bruce said the same police brutality against black people exists here. During Friday's "peaceful protest", she witnessed police attack protestors who wouldn't stop exercising their constitutional rights to protest; she witnessed cops pepper spray a 16-year-old black girl, who had her hands up in the air, chanting, "hands up, don't shoot, and she was among those who had to run from rubber bullets and canisters of tear gas that the police threw at them. She said this is not the America they are fighting for and demanded change. Erik Resnick said he was aghast at the videos that he saw of Friday's events. He thinks the police acted irresponsibly. The video showed the crowed moving up 12th Street while S.W.A.T., the Sheriff and police officers indiscriminately threw tear gas at them. He thinks it's heavy-handed policing and not about protection or service, but instead, about intimidation, dehumanization and a signal of who has power and privilege and who has been deemed unworthy. He believes the citizens of Canton should receive an apology for the events that took place on Friday and he would like an independent investigation regarding those events. He would like to know who, when, and why orders were given to S.W.A.T. to spray tear gas, pepper spray and shoot rubber bullets at the protesters. Anthony Parker said that Friday's events were a direct brutalization of the people of Canton by people sworn to protect. Pregnant women and children were tear-gassed. He said there was nothing professional about what was done, but called it bullying. He said he witnessed children, 15 and 16 year olds being slammed to the pavement by police officers and someone should hold the police accountable. He would like to see transcripts of the events and thinks there needs to be some policy change from this institution. He believes Council and the Mayor must hold the Police Department accountable and believes there should be civilian review boards. Mr. Parker stated "We will not stop occupying these streets until we are met with change, justice and accountability." Joseph Fisher believes what happened on Friday was unacceptable. He believes Council should take action to put changes in the police unions to ensure that police officer who see felonious actions by their co-workers, can report it without fear of losing their jobs. He also thinks Council should ensure that charges are brought against police officers that continue to commit felonious acts of murder and looting of bodies of black and brown people. There should be proper training of the police force. A water bottle was thrown at a cop and the cop responded with tear gas and macing of teenagers and children. He wants to see something done immediately.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS: Clerk Dougherty announced, "At the request and on behalf of the President and Council Members, I completed the required public records and Sunshine Law Training on March 20th. This fulfills the State requirement for the Clerk, President and Council Members". Member Morris said he watched the "peaceful protest" at the White House and then saw the protesters being met with tear gas and rubber bullets. He said he and Member Fisher also watched the video of the Canton protest and commended the citizens who conducted themselves with class. He and Member Fisher reached out to Chief Angelo with their concerns of how the city's police officers provoked the situation with the peaceful residents on Friday night. He was glad that they handled themselves better on Saturday and Sunday. President Sherer commended Mayor Bernabei for going out during the protests and talking to the constituents of our community, which helped to calm the situation, while President Trump was hiding in the basement of the White House. He quoted Martin Luther King's son, "Out of all the democracies in this world, the United States ranks 138th, with their constituents voting." President Sherer said if we want a change, we have got to get people registered to vote. Member Hall said he hopes that the Administration and Council are

looking to handle the events that happened at the end of Friday night and hopes all the issues get addressed. He believes the people need to know why and who gave the orders to S.W.A.T. Member Fisher said that the police did a good job in keeping the violence down but believes, after seeing the video, that they can and should do better. Member Kimbrough thanked the volunteers at Timken High School for helping with the COVID-19 testing. The event was put together by State Representative Thomas West.
