Dear Mr. President and Honorable Members:

The Water Department desires to replace approximately 1.9 miles of failing water mains in the West Manor area. The project area will include the area north of 13TH Street, south of 7TH Street, east of Western Avenue, and west of Delverne Avenue. The Water Department advertised for qualifications from professional engineering firms, and dyutilizing the qualification-based selection process as required by the Ohio Revised Code, have selected Arcadis to perform the detailed design engineering at a total cost of \$149,010.00. The estimated cost of the construction and construction oversight of the project is approximately \$2.7 million, but the Water Department will be applying for OPWC grant and loan funding totaling \$1.5 million to help fund this project.

Therefore, I hereby request legislation that does the following:

- 1. Authorizes the Mayor and/or Director of Public Service to execute a professional services contract with Arcadis for design of the West Manor Area Water Main Replacement Project.

Dear Madam President and Honorable Members:

Earlier this year, Council passed preliminary participatory legislation allowing ODOT to resurface SR43D (Walnut Ave. from 12th St. NE to Market St. N and Market St. N from 12th St. NE to 19th St.), SR43 (19th St. NE to E 55th St.), and SR172 (W Tusc. from Whipple Ave. to Wertz. Ave and from Smith Ave. to IR77) within the City limits. ODOT has now requested the final participatory legislation with their final cost estimate. The estimated cost of Canton's required share of the project is \$1,514,526.00 pending ODOT's bid and final project quantities. This is approximately \$428,626.00 more than ODOT's initial estimate. As a result, we will need to appropriate the remaining funds. Our funding for this project will come from the Comprehensive Plan fund as these are all gateway corridors within the City.

Therefore, I am requesting legislation that does the following:

- 1. Authorizes final participatory legislation that allows ODOT to construct the above described project on SR43D (Walnut/Market)/SR172 (Tuscarawas)/SR 43 (Market), PID 101269, GP1245 pursuant to the attached sample consent legislation.
- 2. Authorizes the Mayor and/or Director of Public Service to enter into all agreements necessary for the construction of said project.
- 3. Makes the following supplemental appropriation amending Ordinance 61/2024 as amended:

FROM: Unappropriated balance of the 2175 Comprehensive Plan fund (\$430,000.00)

TO: 2175 202001 Engineering-Administration - Other \$430,000.00

FINAL RESOLUTION

The following Final Resolution enacted by the City of **Canton**, Ohio, hereinafter referred to as the Legislative Authority/Local Public Agency or "LPA", in the matter of the stated described project.

WHEREAS, on the **12th day of February 2024**, the LPA enacted legislation proposing cooperation with the Director of Transportation for the described project:

The project consists of improvements to Walnut Avenue NE (S.R. 43D) through Market Avenue N from 12th Street NE to 19th Street NW. (S.L.M. 0.00 to S.L.M. 0.75) and Market Avenue N (S.R. 43) to 55th Street NW (S.L.M. 14.40 to S.L.M. 17.14). and Tuscarawas Street NW (S.R. 172) from Whipple Avenue NW to Wertz Avenue NW (S.L.M. 11.85 to S.L.M.12.77) and from Smith Avenue NW to I.R. 77 (S.L.M. 13.28 to 13.46), including, resurfacing, curb, curb and gutter, drainage upgrades, pavement, pavement planing, traffic signal upgrades, and pavement markings, lying within the City of Canton; and

WHEREAS, the LPA shall cooperate with the Director of Transportation in the above described project as follows:

The City agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the entire cost of the improvement within the city limits, less the amount of Federal-Aid funds set aside by the Director of Transportation for the financing of this improvement from funds allocated by the Federal Highway Administration, U. S. Department of Transportation.

The share of the cost of the LPA is now estimated in the amount of **One Million Five Hundred Fourteen Thousand Five Hundred Twenty-Six and - - - - 00/100 Dollars,** (\$1,514,526.00), but said estimated amount is to be adjusted in order that the LPA's ultimate share of said improvement shall correspond with said percentages of actual costs when said actual costs are determined; and

WHEREAS, The Director of Transportation has approved said legislation proposing cooperation and has caused to be made plans and specifications and an estimate of cost and expense for improving the above described highway and has transmitted copies of the same to this legislative authority; and

WHEREAS, The LPA desires the Director of Transportation to proceed with the aforesaid highway improvement.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved:

- I. That the estimated sum, of One Million Five Hundred Fourteen Thousand Five Hundred Twenty-Six and - 00/100 Dollars, (\$1,514,526.00) is hereby appropriated for the improvement described above and the fiscal officer is hereby authorized and directed to issue an order on the treasurer for said sum upon the requisition of the Director of Transportation to pay the cost and expense of said improvement. We hereby agree to assume in the first instance, the share of the cost and expense over and above the amount to be paid from Federal funds.
- II. That the LPA hereby requests the Director of Transportation to proceed with the aforesaid highway improvement.
- III. That the LPA enter into a contract with the State, and that the Mayor or Director of Public Service be, and is hereby authorized to execute said contract, providing for the payment of the LPA the sum of money set forth herein above for improving the described project.
- IV. That the LPA transmit to the Director of Transportation a fully executed copy of this Resolution.

CONTRACT

(Chapter 5521, Ohio Revised Code)

This contract is made by and between the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation, acting through its director (hereinafter referred to as the "STATE"), 1980 West Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43223, and the City of **Canton**, (hereinafter referred to as the legislative authority/Local Public Agency or "LPA").

WITNESSTH:

WHEREAS, Chapter 5521 of the Ohio Revised Code provides that the legislative authority may cooperate with the STATE in a highway project made by and under the supervision of the Director of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, through the enactment of preliminary legislation, the LPA and the STATE have agreed to cooperate in the highway project described below; and

WHEREAS, through the enactment of final legislation, the LPA has committed to pay an estimated amount of money as its share of the total estimated cost and expense of the highway project described below; and

WHEREAS, the fiscal officer of the LPA has filed with the LPA a certificate stating that sufficient moneys are available, as required by Chapter 5521 and Section 5705.41 of the Ohio Revised Code. A duplicate certificate is attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the final legislation, the LPA hereby enters into this contract with the STATE to provide for payment of the agreed portion of the cost of the highway project and any additional obligations for the highway project described below.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the performances of mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, it is agreed by parties hereto as follows:

SECTION I: RECITALS

The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated as a material part of this contract.

SECTION II: PURPOSE

The purpose of this contract is to set forth requirements associated with the highway project described below (hereinafter referred to as the "PROJECT") and to establish the responsibilities for the administration of the PROJECT by the LPA and the STATE.

SECTION III: LEGAL REFERENCES

This contract is established pursuant to Chapter 5521 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION IV: SCOPE OF WORK

The work to be performed under this contract shall consist of the following:

The project consists of improvements to Walnut Avenue NE (S.R. 43D) through Market Avenue N from 12th Street NE to 19th Street NW. (S.L.M. 0.00 to S.L.M. 0.75) and Market Avenue N (S.R. 43) to 55th Street NW (S.L.M. 14.40 to S.L.M. 17.14). and Tuscarawas Street NW (S.R. 172) from Whipple Avenue NW to Wertz Avenue NW (S.L.M. 11.85 to S.L.M.12.77) and from Smith Avenue NW to I.R. 77 (S.L.M. 13.28 to 13.46), including, resurfacing, curb, curb and gutter, drainage upgrades, pavement, pavement planing, traffic signal upgrades, and pavement markings, lying within the City of Canton.

SECTION V: FINANCIAL PARTICIPATION

- 1. The STATE agrees to provide the necessary funds as enumerated in this section and allowed by law for the financing of this project.
- 2. The STATE may allocate the money contributed by the LPA in whatever manner it deems necessary in financing the cost of construction, right-of-way, engineering, and incidental expenses, notwithstanding the percentage basis of contribution by the LPA.
- 3. The total cost and expenses for the project are only an estimate and the total cost and expenses may be adjusted by the STATE. If any adjustments are required, payment of additional funds shall correspond with the percentages of actual costs when said actual costs are determined, and as requested, by the Director of Transportation.
- 4. The LPA agrees to pay to the STATE its share of the total estimated cost expense for the above highway project in the amount of **One Million Five Hundred Fourteen Thousand Five Hundred Twenty-Six and - 00/100 Dollars, (\$1,514,526.00)**.
- 5. The City agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the entire cost of the improvement within the city limits, less the amount of Federal-Aid funds set aside by the Director of Transportation for the financing of this improvement from funds allocated by the Federal Highway Administration, U. S. Department of Transportation.
- 6. The LPA agrees to assume and bear One Hundred Percent (100%) of the cost of any construction items required by the LPA on the entire project, which are not necessary for the improvement, as determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration.

7. The LPA agrees that change orders and extra work contracts required fulfilling the construction contracts shall be processed as needed. The STATE shall not approve a change order or extra work contract until it first gives notice, in writing, to the LPA. The LPA shall contribute its share of the cost of these items in accordance with other sections herein.

SECTION VI: RIGHT-OF-WAY AND UTILITIES

- The LPA agrees that all right-of-way required for the described project will be acquired and/or made available in accordance with current State and Federal regulations. The LPA also understands that right-of-way costs include eligible utility costs.
- 2. The LPA agrees that all utility accommodation, relocation, and reimbursement will comply with the current provisions of 23 CFR 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual, including that:
 - A. Arrangements have been or will be made with all utilities where facilities are affected by the described PROJECT, that the utilities have agreed to make all necessary removals and/or relocations to clear any construction called for by the plans of this PROJECT, and that the utilities have agreed to make the necessary removals and/or relocations after notification by the LPA or STATE.
 - B. The LPA shall, at its own expense, make all removals and/or relocations of publicly-owned utilities which do not comply with the reimbursement provisions of the ODOT Utilities Manual. Publicly-owned facilities which do comply with the reimbursement provisions of the ODOT Utilities Manual will be removed and/or relocated at project expense, exclusive of betterments.
 - C. The removals and/or relocation of all utilities shall be done in such a manner as not to interfere with the operation of the contractor constructing the PROJECT and that the utility removals and/or relocations shall be approved by the STATE and performed in accordance with the provisions of the ODOT Construction and Materials Specifications.

SECTION VII: ADDITIONAL PROJECT OBLIGATIONS

- 1. The STATE shall initiate the competitive bid letting process and award the PROJECT in accordance with ODOT's policies and procedures.
- 2. The LPA agrees:
 - A. To keep said highway open to traffic at all times;

- B. To maintain the PROJECT in accordance with the provisions of the statutes relating thereto,
- C. To make ample financial and other provisions for such maintenance of the PROJECT after its completion;
- D. To maintain the right-of-way and keep it free of obstructions in a manner satisfactory to the STATE and hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes;
- E. To place and maintain all traffic control devices conforming to the Ohio Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices on the project in compliance with the provisions of Section 4511.11 of the Ohio Revised Code;
- F. To regulate parking in accordance with Section 4511.66 of the Ohio Revised Code, unless otherwise controlled by local ordinance or resolution.

SECTION VIII: DISPUTES

In the event that any disputes arise between the STATE and LPA concerning interruption of or performance pursuant to this contract, such disputes shall be resolved solely and finally by the Director of Transportation.

SECTION IX: NOTICE

Notice under this contract shall be directed as follows:

SECTION X: FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. In carrying out this contract, LPA shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, disability, or age. LPA will ensure that applicants are hired and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, religion, color, sex, national origin (ancestry), disability, genetic information, or age (40 years or older), sexual orientation, or military status (past, present, future). Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: Employment, Upgrading, Demotion, or Transfer; Recruitment or Recruitment Advertising; Layoff or Termination; Rates of Pay or other forms of Compensation; and Selection for Training including Apprenticeship.

- 2. To the extent necessary under Ohio law, LPA agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause. LPA will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of LPA, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, color, sex, national origin (ancestry), disability, genetic information, age (40 years or older), sexual orientation, or military status (past, present, future). If applicable, the LPA shall incorporate the foregoing requirements of this paragraph in all of its contracts for any of the work prescribed herein (other than subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials) and will require all of its subcontractors for any part of such work to incorporate such requirements in all subcontracts for such work.
- 3. LPA agrees to fully comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 USC Sec. 2000. LPA shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, or national origin in its programs or activities. The Director of Transportation may monitor the Contractor's compliance with Title VI.

SECTION XI: GENERAL PROVISIONS

- This contract constitutes the entire contract between the parties. All prior discussions and understandings between the parties are superseded by this contract.
- 2. Neither this contract nor any rights, duties or obligations described herein shall be assigned by either party hereto without the prior express written consent of the other party.
- 3. Any change to the provisions of this contract must be made in a written amendment executed by both parties.
- 4. This contract and any claims arising out of this contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Ohio. Any provision of this contract prohibited by the law of Ohio shall be deemed void and of no effect. Any litigation arising out of or relating in any way to this contract or the performance thereunder shall be brought only in the courts of Ohio, and the LPA hereby irrevocably consents to such jurisdiction. To the extent that the STATE is a party to any litigation arising out of or relating in any way to this contract or the performance thereunder, such an action shall be brought only in a court of competent jurisdiction in Franklin County, Ohio.
- 5. All financial obligations of the State of Ohio, as provided in this contract, are subject to the provisions of Section 126.07 of the Ohio Revised Code. The financial obligations of the State of Ohio shall not be valid and enforceable unless funds are appropriated by the Ohio General Assembly and encumbered by the STATE. Additionally, it is understood that this financial obligation of the LPA shall not be valid and enforceable unless funds are appropriated by the LPA's legislative body.

- 6. This contract shall be deemed to have been substantially performed only when fully performed according to its terms and conditions and any modification thereof.
- 7. LPA agrees that it is currently in compliance and will continue to adhere to the requirements of Ohio Ethics law as provided by Section 102.03 and 102.04 of the Ohio Revised Code.

RE: Request for Legislation - Tree Contractor License Requirements Update

Dear Madam President and Honorable Members:

The Engineering Department and Tree Commission have respectfully requested a change to the licensure requirements for approving contractors who perform work within the City's urban forest. Currently, Canton Codified Ordinance 917.09(f)(4) reads as follows:

Evidence of current Certified Arborist accreditation, with a copy of the ISA certified arborist identification number on file.

Practically, this has posed an issue as most contractors who perform this work do not necessarily have an ISA certification. If this ordinance were strictly enforced, we would almost certainly find ourselves in a situation where there are not enough tree contractors to serve the needs of the public. As a result, the Tree Commission has voted to recommend that this provision be changed to read as follows:

Evidence of current certified Arborist accreditation or other experience and/or training satisfactory to the Director of Public Service and or designee that demonstrates knowledge and experience of proper tree care.

This change would eliminate the issue while giving the Engineering Department the flexibility to license contractors who demonstrate competency either through additional training and/or experience within the industry.

Therefore, I hereby request legislation that does the following:

1. Updates Canton Codified Ordinance 917.09(f)(4) to read as follows: "Evidence of current certified Arborist accreditation or other experience and/or training satisfactory to the Director of Public Service and or designee that demonstrates knowledge and experience of proper tree care.
