

RE: Mills Business Park Tax Increment Financing (TIF) District Amendment and Cooperative Disbursement Agreement Amendment

Dear Madam President and Honorable Members:

The Mills TIF District, originally created pursuant to Ord. No. 59-2011, allowed for the capturing of TIF funds from the development of the business park to refund costs associated with the public infrastructure improvements. In late 2022, Canton City Council voted to amend the original TIF District creating two new, geographically separate districts and creating two new Ordinances No. 282-2022 & 283-2022 in the process.

An additional amendment to Ordinances No. 282-2022 & 283-2022 is requested in order to remove one parcel from the TIF District created via Ord. No. 282-2022 and place into the TIF District created via Ord. No. 283-2022. There will be no other changes to either ordinance but for the subtraction of one parcel from one TIF District to be added to the other TIF District.

The proposed amendments to Ord. No. 282-2022 & Ord. No. 283-2022 include:

- Remove Stark County tax parcel 10016331 from Mills Industrial Park TIF District (Ord. No. 282-2022) and add to Mills Business Park TIF District (Ord. No. 283-2022). The new maps for each TIF District are attached hereto as Exhibits A & B.

I hereby request legislation which does the following:

- 1. Amends Ord. No. 282-2022 to remove permanent parcel number 10016331.
- 2. Amends Ord. No. 283-2022 to add permanent parcel number 10016331.
- 3. Authorizes the Mayor or Director of Public Service to amend the existing TIF Cooperative Disbursement Agreement with Canton Commerce Development, LLC for the addition of permanent parcel number 10016331.
- 4. Declares this ordinance to be an emergency measure.



The Canton Local School District will be notified the intent of the City of Canton to declare such improvements as public purpose.





RE: City-wide Admissions & Parking Tax

Dear Madam President and Honorable Members:

Across the State of Ohio, municipalities such as Cleveland, Sandusky, Cincinnati, Youngstown, and dozens more collect an admissions and parking tax in order support the growth which accompanies tourism and entertainment development. As you are aware, the City of Canton has no such tax that it collects or retains for its own purposes. While the City of Canton and Stark County continue to grow and develop the area's tourism and entertainment sectors, it is important to capitalize on the opportunity to generate additional revenue for City use.

Many of the City's that collect such taxes directly contribute those funds to support the development that feeds it. Much of the growing tourism in Canton and Stark County can be attributed to such assets as the Pro Football Hall of Fame, Hall of Fame Village, Gervasi Vineyard and other local attractions. While all of these assets are equally important, many of them have been and continue to be supported through other means thus leaving an opportunity for those assets to support the City of Canton in different ways.

As these various assets continue to attract hundreds of thousands of visitors year over year for concerts, exhibitions, sporting events, recreational activity and general tourism; it gives the opportunity to turn those visitors into direct supporters of Canton's ability to grow. This is an opportunity for the City to leverage those outside dollars for additional revenue generation which will be used to support government operations, tourism development, economic development, and infrastructure improvement and development throughout the City.

Thus, it is the administration's desire to impose a city-wide admissions tax of 3% and parking tax of 3%.

The admissions tax shall be applicable to such places that have an admission charge which may be such establishments that charge for season tickets or subscriptions, have a minimum service charge, cover charge or charge for seats and tables, and other applicable charges. This would most likely be in establishment such as, but not limited to: circuses, motion picture theatres, dance halls, auditoriums, stadiums, athletic pavilions and fields, exhibition halls, swimming pools, amusement parks, water parks, golf courses and gold ranges, and other various establishments. There would be exemptions for governmental entities acting in their government capacity and performing governmental functions and activities; charitable events, educational events, qualifying non-profits and entities or transactions exempted under existing provisions of the Ohio Revised Code.

The parking tax shall be applicable to such areas, structures, or facilities which charge for parking and are not within the public right-of-way. On-street and publicly owned parking are not subject to taxation.

Additionally, it is the desire of the administration for the parking and admissions taxes to take effect January 1, 2025. This gives ample time for impacted businesses to prepare for and administer the taxes once in effect.

Therefore, I hereby request legislation which does the following:

- 1. Authorizes a city-wide admissions tax of 3%, subject to certain exemptions.
- 2. Authorizes a city-wide parking tax of 3%.
- 3. Establishes the 2195 Admission Tax Fund to allow for the admissions taxes to be collected and disbursed.
- 4. Establishes the 2196 Parking Tax Fund to allow for the parking taxes to be collected and disbursed.
- 5. Amends Chapter 187 to allow for a city-wide admissions tax.
- 6. Establishes Chapter 188 to allow for a city-wide parking tax
- 7. Authorizes the Mayor and/or Director of Public Service, City Auditor and City Treasurer to take any and all actions necessary and to enter into any agreements necessary for the levying of the admissions and parking taxes.
- 8. Authorizes and directs the Auditor to draw his warrants upon receipt of vouchers duly approved by the proper departmental authority.
- 9. Declares these ordinances to be emergency measures.

Dear Madame President and Honorable Members of Council:

Re: Adult Use Cannabis

As you are aware, Ohio citizens voted to legalize the sale of marijuana for recreational use in November of 2023. The State of Ohio responded by adopting Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3780 (effective December 7, 2023), established comprehensive regulations covering legalized cultivation, processing, dispensing and laboratory testing of adult use cannabis. On June 7, 2024 applications began to be accepted by the State for licenses to sell adult use cannabis.

In 2017, the City of Canton passed an ordinance to regulate medical marijuana in Chapter 789 of the codified ordinances.

The Law Director has met with the Administration and its various affected departments to discuss regulations of adult use cannabis. Changes to the zoning code will also be considered under a separate communication.

In order to have new regulations in place that govern adult use cannabis before the licenses are granted, adoption of these regulations is respectfully requested at the meeting on **June 17**, **2024** in order to have the regulations in place prior to any licenses being granted by the State.

Therefore, I hereby request legislation which does the following:

1. Amends Part Seven, Business Regulations Code by enacting Chapter 790 of the Canton Codified Ordinances entitled Adult Use Cannabis Control Canton City Council June 13, 2024 Page 2

- 2. Authorizes and directs the Auditor to draw his warrants upon receipt of vouchers duly approved by the proper departmental authority.
- 3. Declares this ordinance to be an emergency measure.

Dear Madam President and Honorable Members:

As you know the City is currently working on multiple upgrades to the Canton Memorial Civic Center. These include updated lighting, HVAC, and audio-visual systems. Moving forward, the next two items to be addressed will most likely be seating and ADA compliant bathrooms to the north. In order to move forward with the bathroom project, one issue that needs to be addressed is the access into the lot north of the Civic Center. Currently, the drive is adjacent to a vacant building that was formerly occupied by a Wendy's and then an Arby's. At this time the City is looking to purchase this building in order to plan for the future restroom expansion and further development of the Civic Center. It is important that we acquire it now, while it is vacant, as this is when our costs and the building's value will be at their lowest. Presently, we have signed a letter of intent to purchase this parcel for \$600,000.00 pending Canton City Council approval. This is the current Auditor's appraised value of the property. The funds for this purchase will be taken from the Comprehensive Plan fund as the Civic Center is a part of an important gateway to our downtown.

Therefore, I am requesting legislation for the following:

- 1. Authorizes the Mayor and/or Director of Public Service to negotiate and enter into agreement for the purchase of Stark County Auditor parcel number 10006390 for an amount not to exceed \$600,000.00.
- 2. Authorizes the Mayor and/or Director of Public Service to enter into any agreements necessary to facilitate the above-named purchase.
- 3. Authorizes and directs the Auditor to pay any and all moral obligations for this purchase.
- 4. Amends Ordinance 61/2024, as amended, with the following supplemental appropriation:

Dear Madame President and Honorable Members:

On Tuesday, June 11, 2024, the Canton City Planning Commission met and considered Planning Department recommendations for amendments to the Canton City Zoning and Planning Code, namely amendments pertaining to Chapter 1131 – Definitions, Chapter 1198.02 – Application for Conditional Use Permit, and Chapter 1198.12 – Medical Marijuana Facilities Including Cultivation Facilities, Processing Facilities, Dispensaries, and Testing Laboratories. The Canton City Planning Commission recommended approval of the subject amendments at that meeting.

In November 2023, Ohio voters approved a ballot measure to legalize adult use recreational marijuana use. With the changes at the state level, the city must also implement changes to the Zoning Code that will locally regulate this industry within the city limits while also considering the public health, safety, convenience, comfort, prosperity, and general welfare.

The proposed amendment to Chapter 1131 offers a definition of "Marijuana Facility" and further defines the four subsets of those facilities – Cultivator, Dispensary, Processor, and Testing Laboratory.

The proposed amendment to Chapter 1198.02 adds language regarding application fees for Conditional Use Permits and adds language pertaining to Adult Use Cannabis Operators.

The proposed amendments to Chapter 1198.12 adds Adult Use Cannabis Operators to the already existing Medical Marijuana language, and also adds some additional spacing requirements and establishes permissible hours of operation for this type of business.

Thus, I am respectfully requesting that legislation be enacted to authorize the subject code amendments of the Canton City Zoning and Planning Code.

#### 1131. Definitions

Marijuana Facility: Any entity that has been issued a certificate or license by the State of Ohio to operate as a cultivator, dispensary, processor, or testing facility of medical marijuana or adult use cannabis operators, as defined by Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3780.01 (colloquially called "recreational marijuana"). The following are Marijuana Facility use types:

A. Cultivator: An entity that has been issued a certificate of operation by the State of Ohio to grow, harvest, package, and transport marijuana.

•

- B. Dispensary: An entity licensed by the State of Ohio pursuant to section 3780.15 of the Revised Code and any rules promulgated thereunder to sell marijuana products to qualifying patients, caregivers, and for adult use cannabis as authorized.
- C. Processor: An entity that has been issued a certificate of operation by the State of Ohio pursuant to section 3780.14 of the revised Code and any rules promulgated thereunder to manufacture medical marijuana and adult use cannabis products.
- D. Testing Laboratory: An independent laboratory that has been issued a license by the division of cannabis control by the State of Ohio to have custody and use of adult use cannabis for scientific purposes and for purposes of instruction, research, or analysis.

#### 1198.02 - Application for Conditional Use Permit

An application for a conditional use permit shall be filed with the Chairman of the Board of Zoning Appeals by at least one owner or his designated agent of property for which such conditional use is proposed. A fee of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) shall be paid to the Zoning Inspector at the time a conditional use permit is requested; an additional non-refundable fee of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) shall be paid for Medical Marijuana Entities and adult use cannabis operators, which the Zoning Inspector shall forthwith pay to the Auditor's Office to the credit of the City. At a minimum, the application shall contain the following information:

- a. The name, address and phone number of the applicant;
- b. The legal description of the property;
- c. A description of the existing use;
- d. The present zoning district;
- e. A description of the proposed conditional use;
- f. A plan of the proposed site for the conditional use showing the location of all buildings, parking and loading areas, traffic access and traffic circulation, open spaces, landscaping, refuse and service areas, utilities, signs, yards and such other information as the Board may require to determine if the proposed conditional use meets the intent and requirements of this Zoning Ordinance;

- g. A narrative statement evaluating the effects of such elements as noise, glare, odor, fumes and vibration on adjoining property; a discussion of the general compatibility with adjacent and other properties in the district; and the relationship of the proposed use to the comprehensive plan;
- Such other information as may be required in Chapter 1197.05. (Ord. 55-77.
   Passed 2-14-77.) (Ord. 181-2009. Passed 9-28-09. Ord. 54-2011. Passed 4-11-11.)

# 1198.12 – Medical Marijuana Facilities <u>and Adult Use Cannabis Operators</u> Including Cultivation Facilities, Processing Facilities, Dispensaries, and Testing Laboratories

The Board of Zoning Appeals shall review the particular facts and circumstances of each proposed Conditional Use Permit for Medical Marijuana Facilities and Adult Use Cannabis Operators including Cultivation Facilities, Dispensaries, Processing Facilities, and Testing Laboratories and consider the following:

#### a. Medical Marijuana Facilities

- 1. No medical marijuana facility or adult use cannabis operator shall be located within 500 feet of a school, church, public-park, public playground, or public library, preschool, child day care facility, or other use established specifically for the activities of minors, or any other use consistent with state of Ohio spacing requirements, as provided in Ohio R.C. 3796.09, and 3796.10, and 3780, as amended, and the analogous provisions in the Ohio Administrative Code.
- 2. A Dispensary shall not be located within 1,000 feet of another Dispensary.
- 4.3. The hours of operation of a Dispensary shall be limited to 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., or other hours consistent with a Marijuana Dispensary permit issued by the State of Ohio, as a condition of development approval.
- 2.4. Prohibited location: no medical marijuana facility or facility for adult use cannabis operations shall be located in a residentially zoned area.
- 3.5.In addition to the general standards listed in 1198.03 applicable to all conditional uses under this code, the Board of Zoning Appeals, when studying a petition for a conditional use, shall consider the following criteria:
  - a. The impact of the proposed use on public safety in the surrounding community.
  - b. The impact of the proposed use on the economic welfare of the surrounding community.
  - c. The impact of the proposed use on the general welfare of the surrounding community in regard to any odor emanating from the proposed use, and the mandatory use of a state-of-the art filtration system.
  - d. The impact of the proposed use on any disproportional concentration of medical or adult use cannabis operator marijuana

- cultivation facilities, processing facilities, testing laboratories or dispensaries in the surrounding community.
- e. Regarding medical or adult use cannabis operator marijuana dispensaries, the location of the proposed use in relation to medical or pharmaceutical facilities of a complimentary nature (e.g. pharmacies, physician offices, etc.)
- 4.6. The petitioner shall comply with all local and state laws pertaining to medical and adult use cannabis operator marijuana facilities for cultivation, processing, dispensing and/or testing, including all local and state licensing requirements. If the petitioner has not obtained a state provisional license within one year of the Board of Zoning Appeals Council granting a conditional use permit, the conditional use permit shall expire at that time. Dear Madame President and Honorable Members:

On Tuesday, June 11, 2024, the Canton City Planning Commission met and recommended approval of the proposed City Wide Zone Change as outlined below. The changes as proposed have originated from the Planning Department and the Planning Commission for City Council's consideration. Maps showing the location of the proposed areas are included.

The proposed changes in zoning are as follows:

- 1. Harmont Ave NE and 35<sup>th</sup> St NE from R-1a to B-3 Parcel Nos. 380279 & 380280 Ward 6 This property is owned by Canton Crossroads United Methodist Church, and has become useful to Canton for All People in fulfilling their mission of helping the people of Canton. That activity is certainly not Single-Family residential in nature, but it is a very necessary service to the community. With this in mind, staff believes a preemptive zoning that will create an environment to assist in the property realizing its greatest potential and its highest and best use is the best way of supporting Canton for All People's efforts in this location while also applying sound land use policy in providing zoning that will allow the property to grow in this commercial area.
- 2. 1817 Fulton Rd NW from R-3 & B-1 to B-1 Parcel No. 235903 Ward 7 This property currently has a zoning designation that splits the property down the middle. This proposed change is intended to correct this apparent error on the map.
- 3. 2222 Fulton Rd NW from R-1a & B-1 to B-1 Parcel No. 245644 Ward 7 This property is another instance of having two separate zoning designations on the same parcel. This proposed action is intended to fix this error.
- 4. 2223 Fulton Rd NW from R-1a & B-1 to B-1 Parcel No. 240604 Ward 7 This property is again one that has two separate zoning designation on the same property. This proposed change will fix this.

- 5. Marietta Ave NE from R-1 to R-1a Parcel 400878 Ward 4 This property has long been underutilized vacant land, and with an anticipation of potential new housing, this change is being proposed to provide support for the perceived potential of the area. With the cost of housing construction on a constant rise, and as trends in the industry have illustrated, the area and bulk requirements associated with the R-1a zoning district will provide a more inviting environment for development than the current zoning allows.
- 6. 2207 Kimball Rd SE from I-1 & B-3 to I-1 Parcel No. 244939 Ward 4 This proposed change in intended to ensure the entire property has the same zoning designation. While staff believe the sliver of B-3 on the parcel may have been a mapping error, this process will make the zoning appear correct and will align with the parcel lines.
- 7. 2000-2100 Block of Kimball Rd SE from B-3 & I-1 to B-3 Parcel Nos. 203816, 209300, 209301, 209303, 209304, 239242, 239244, 239246, 239264, 239266, 239272, 282529, 282531, & 282549 Ward 4 This proposed change is again intended to align the zoning designations with the property lines, rather than have properties with split zoning designations.

This proposal is in line with the theories of the Comprehensive Plan as the changes will promote the city's competitiveness within the region, strengthen the city's position to potentially attract development, and clean up long time issues with portions of the zoning map.



Dear Madam President and Honorable Members:

As you may know, the Palace Theatre is currently planning an expansion and renovation project. At this time, it is estimated that this project could cost approximately \$16 million. Given the Palace Theatre's importance to Canton and its downtown, we are proposing two related projects that will both assist with and supplement this development. First, in order to facilitate the Palace's construction, the storm sewer and water line need to be relocated along 6th Street NW. Similar to what we have done with other projects (the Aultman Timken Family Cancer Center and the Canton City Schools Athletic Facility), we are proposing utilizing Comprehensive Plan funds for this work. The design work for this is already being completed by the Palace's engineer, and we would bid this late summer/early fall.

The second project would be a continuation of both the Palace project and the Court Ave. Master planning process. Specifically, we would be looking to do streetscape improvements on 6<sup>th</sup> Street from Cleveland Ave. to Market Ave. and Court Ave. from 5<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> Street NW. It is estimated that this streetscape work would cost approximately \$950,000.00. This would not be bid and contracted until late 2025 or early 2026. However, we need to enter into contract for the design of this now. Since this work includes the terminus of the larger Court Ave. planning area, we are proposing doing the design work for all of Court Ave. beginning at approximately 4<sup>th</sup> Street SW and terminating at 6<sup>th</sup> Street NW. Doing all of the design now will both ensure that the current project ties into future development while also giving us plans to utilize for future grant opportunities. This design work will also come from Comprehensive Plan funds. The cost for the design is \$235,000.00. This brings the total amount for work being done in 2024 to approximately \$585,000.00. These funds will need appropriated. The appropriation amount is being recommended at \$650,000.00 due to the unpredictability of the bidding process.

Therefore, I hereby request legislation that does the following:

- 1. Authorizes the Mayor and/or Director of Public Service to advertise, receive bids, award and enter into multiple contracts for the 6th Street NW and Court Ave. NW Utilities G.P. 1473 and Streetscape Projects G. P. 1445 (Palace Theatre).
- 2. Authorizes the Mayor and/or Director of Public Service to execute one or more professional services contracts for design and oversight of these projects.
- Authorizes and directs the Auditor to pay any and all moral obligations for contract change orders that are otherwise approved by the Board of Control pursuant to Canton Codified Ordinance 105.14 within the established dollar amount thresholds for the above-named projects.




