The City of Canton's Health Department was approved through the capital purchasing process to buy a dump truck to help with city-wide clean-ups. The vehicle was ordered through Liberty Ford and the cost was \$70,075.52 which was \$14,000 under the approved purchase amount. The manager in charge of the area that the vehicle will be used by has resigned and is no longer employed by the City of Canton. Unfortunately, the manager ordered the vehicle prior to having a purchase order opened for said purchase. This has created a moral obligation for the City of Canton and its Health Department. In order to pay the vendor, Liberty Ford for the above mentioned dump truck, we are required to have this Council approve a moral obligation.

Therefore, I hereby request legislation that does the following:

- 1. Authorizes and directs the Auditor to pay a moral obligation in the amount of \$70,075.52 to Liberty Ford with the passage of this ordinance.
- 2. Retroactively authorizes any and all actions taken in order to ensure that the moral obligations in question are paid in a timely manner.
- 3. Authorizes the Auditor to draw warrants upon receipt of vouchers duly approved by the proper departmental authority.
- 4. Declares this ordinance to be an emergency measure.

Dear Madame President and Honorable Members:

On Tuesday, August 13, 2024, the Canton City Planning Commission met and considered Planning Department recommendations for amendments to the Canton City Zoning and Planning Code, namely amendments pertaining to Chapter 1131 – Definitions and Chapter 1147 - Permitted Uses – Business & Industrial Zoning Districts. The Canton City Planning Commission recommended approval of the subject amendments at that meeting.

Data Centers are a relatively new type of land use that many jurisdictions have not addressed or defined in their zoning ordinances. Those few that have an existing definition, seem to have an outdated definition. Fundamentally, data centers consist of networked computer systems used for data storage and processing, along with supporting equipment such as batteries, power generators, and cooling devices. Industry analysts have predicted a sustained growth in data center construction in the coming years. With this in mind, the City of Canton would be irresponsible to not address the potential of data centers establishing in the city. The City's relatively low water and energy costs make this area prime for such a development, and sooner rather than later. With this in mind, the Planning Staff is proposing amendments to allow such uses in the city.

The proposed amendment to Chapter 1131 offers a definition of "Data Center" that previously did not exist in the zoning code.

The proposed amendment to Chapter 1147 adds to the existing table where data centers would be a permissible use, being I-1 and I-2 zoning districts.

Thus, I am respectfully requesting that legislation be enacted to authorize the subject code amendments of the Canton City Zoning and Planning Code.

#### 1131. Definitions

Data Center: a facility used primarily for the storage, management, processing, and transmission of digital data, which houses computer, telecommunication, and/or network equipment, systems, servers, appliances, and other associated components related to digital data operations. Such facility may also include air handlers, power generators, water cooling and storage facilities, utility substations, and other associated utility infrastructure to support sustained operations at a data center.

#### Footnotes:

- (1) Parking areas adjacent to and accessory to the principal use of multi-family residential, community service, business or industry, but not for the purpose of a commercial parking lot.
- (2) Including such uses as drug store, beer and wine carryout/drive-thru and restaurant.
- (3) Office and display, provided all work is done within the confines of the building.
- (4) No repair, painting or washing; and provided that no vehicle parts shall be kept or stored outside of the building.
- (5) Provided that all operations, except as herein modified, shall be conducted within the confines of a building; and provided that the building shall have no openings, other than required fire exits or stationary windows, within fifty feet of any R-District, or twenty feet from any residential structure.

  (6) for storage of personal or other property, provided that all open areas and parking shall be screened from view of any adjoining R-District by a solid

fence, wall or planting screen not less than six feet nor more than eight feet in height.

- (7) Uses such as the following, provided that the building shall have no openings, other than required fire exits or stationary windows, within 100 feet of any R- District, or fifty feet from any residential structure.
- (8) provided that such is incidental to a retail business conducted on the premises; and provided that not more than sixty percent (60%) of the gross floor area shall be used for such processing and manufacturing; and provided that such is not objectionable because of noise, smoke, dust or other nuisance. (9) (such facility to be distinguishable from a junkyard or salvage yard by the fact that only common household recyclables are to be handled); and provided that such use be limited to 10,000 square feet of floor area, all operations and storage to be within the building; such building to be no closer

than fifty feet from an R-District nor twenty feet from any lot line; and provided that the property be maintained in a safe, sanitary and neat appearance.

(10) No mortuaries.

- (11) Provided that no part of a building occupied by such uses shall have any opening other than stationary windows or required fire exits within 100 feet of any R-District.
- (12) Located not less than 200 feet from any R-District.

- (13) Provided that the principal building shall be located not less than 100 feet from any R-District.
- (14) Provided that such structure housing the crematorium shall be setback a minimum of 300 feet from any single-family residential and two-family residential use, a public school, or park and that such use in a Business District is accessory to and part of an established funeral home.
- (15) Provided the site contains a minimum of three (3) acres, buildings shall be located 100 feet from all property lines, if a site abuts a residential zone, the 50 feet closest to said zone shall be maintained with evergreen trees of 4 to 6 feet in height at the time of planting and planted approximately 30 feet apart, or a hedge approximately 4 feet in height at the time of planting or a fence with a minimum of 6 feet in height constructed of vinyl or metal mesh screening, and the remaining 50 feet may be used for vehicular parking including trucks and trailers. All site development at the terminal site must be reviewed and approved by the City's Site Plan Review Committee.
- (16) Provided that such use is not less than 125 feet from public land or a residence district. Such use shall have a 10-foot-high masonry wall or other suitable screening materials completely enclosing the property on all sides but not closer to the street line than the building set back line.
- (17) Provided that all operations and storage be conducted within the confines of a building and that the building be no closer than 200 feet to an R-District and no closer than fifty feet from any lot line, and further provided that any outdoor storage of vehicles and/or trash bins be located no closer than 200 feet from an R-District.
- (18) Located not less than 600 feet from any R-District and not less than 200 feet from any other district except an I-1 District.
- (19) Pursuant to provisions and requirements of Chapter 1185 of this Zoning Ordinance.
- (20) Includes union, charitable, finance, professional, and consulting offices, but does not include retail or wholesale activities.
- (21) Provided such use shall not abut a single-family or two-family residential structure or district, and that such use shall be not less than twenty-five feet from any other lot in an R-District.
- (22) Pursuant to provisions and requirements of Chapter 1198.13 of this Zoning Ordinance.

RE: Request for Legislation - Sidewalk and Curb Replacement Program Codified Ordinance Update

Dear Madam President and Honorable Members:

One of the primary goals of Mayor Sherer and the current administration is the improvement of Canton's neighborhoods. One specific issue that needs to be addressed are sidewalks. As per the Codified Ordinances property owners are responsible for the condition, repair, and replacement of curbs and sidewalks on their property. In recent years, Council has taken several actions to expand the sidewalk program whereas the City assists and participates with the replacement. Currently our program, which pays for 50% of the cost of the project, only applies to residential properties. We would like to expand this to apply to any property/property owner with the caveat that any property owner who wishes to take advantage of this program be compliant with the requirements of Codified Ordinance 105.07 (a). Essentially, all financial obligations to City must be fulfilled to be eligible. Also, we would like to require that the property owner have no outstanding Building/Code or Health Department issues/citations to be eligible. The goal of these changes is to increase participation in the program while also ensuring that only those who meet certain requirements may participate.

Therefore, I hereby request legislation that does the following:

1. Amends Chapter 919, Sidewalk and Curb Replacement Program, of the Canton Codified Ordinances as per the attached.



#### 919.01 PURPOSE.

The City of Canton, through the Office of the Director of Public Service, is hereby authorized to assist private property owners in the replacement of sidewalk, curb or combined curb and gutter in accordance with the procedures set forth in this chapter. The purpose of this chapter shall be to encourage private property owners to replace deteriorating sidewalk, curb or combined curb and gutter—in residential—area; the program shall be limited to sidewalk replacement projects which comply with the criteria set forth in this chapter.

(Ord. 59-2001, Passed 4-9-01.)

### 919.02 PROPERTY OWNER ELIGIBILITY.

(a) Property owners shall be compliant with the requirements listed in Codified Ordinance 105.07 (a) in order to be eligible for the sidewalk program.

- (b) Property owners shall have no outstanding citations or obligations to the Building and Code Department and/or Health Department in order to be eligible for the Sidewalk and Curb Replacement Program.
- —Eligibility-to-participate in the Sidewalk-and-Gurb-Replacement-Program is limited to private single family or duplex residential properties within the City-of-Ganton. All other commercial properties are limited to eligibility solely for the removal of sidewalk and curb.

(Ord. 59-2001. Passed 4-9-01.)

#### 919.03 HAZARDOUS SIDEWALK OR CURB.

- (a) A hazardous sidewalk is defined for the purposes of the Sidewalk and Curb Replacement Program as a sidewalk which exhibits any of the following criteria:
  - (1) A vertical separation of more than 1.5 inches at either a crack or joint;
  - (2) A horizontal separation or crack greater than 1 inch;
  - (3) The cross slope of the sidewalk is unnecessarily greater than 1-1/2 inch per foot;
  - (4) Water accumulation due to insufficient grade of the sidewalk;
  - (5) Severely rough, uneven surface due to spalling;
  - (6) Severe cracking;
  - (7) Missing pieces;
- (8) Gross deterioration due to tree roots or other decay caused by the pressure of trees;
  - (9) Deterioration due to unauthorized vehicular traffic or parking on a sidewalk; and
- (10) Other conditions not listed above which render the sidewalk/curb hazardous for public use as determined by the City Engineering Department.
- (b) A hazardous curb is defined as a curb that exhibits missing portions, broken pieces, excessively raised or settled portions, and severe cracking as determined by the City Engineering Department. (Ord. 59-2001. Passed 4-9-01.)

#### 919.04 RESPONSIBILITIES OF CITY AND PROPERTY OWNERS.

The City of Canton's participation in sidewalk replacement projects shall include the removal of all eligible sidewalk, curb or combined curb and gutter within the designated sidewalk replacement projects. The City shall reimburse fifty percent (50%) of the cost of the removal and replacement of the new sidewalk, curb or combined curb and gutters as provided in Section 919.02 or the City will pay the contractor directly and assess the

property owner's 50% share of the cost at 0% interest, to be paid semi-annually, to the property tax bill for a period of five (5) years. The participating property owners shall be responsible for all of the remaining costs associated with the construction of the replacement sidewalk, curb or combined curb and gutter, to include, but not be limited to, additional excavation, engineering, grading, drainage and construction, which shall be performed to the City's specifications and in accordance with governing ordinances. The property owners shall also be responsible for negotiating with any utility companies for the relocation of any utilities affected by the project.

(Ord. 158-2022. Passed 7-11-22.)

#### 919.05 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE.

The Director of Public Service shall be responsible for implementing the procedures contained in this chapter and shall have sole and final discretion in determining the City's participation in any proposed sidewalk removal and/or replacement project.

(Ord. 59-2001, Passed 4-9-01.)

#### 919.06 APPLICATION PROCEDURES.

- (a) The Director of Public Service shall establish procedures by which written applications requesting the City's assistance for sidewalk replacement projects may be initiated. The application shall contain the description of the proposed project, and project area, to include the full names of the owners, street addresses, lot numbers and front footage amounts of each parcel of real property adjoining the project area, the signatures of the title owners of each parcel of real property, the name and address of the licensed general sidewalk contractor for the project, who has the contractual authority to contract with the City and the general contractor for the completion of the project. (Ord. 158-2022. Passed 7-11-22.)
- (b) The City's participation shall require the procurement of three price quotations from City licensed sidewalk contractors. This requirement may be waived by the Service Director or designee. Fifty percent (50%) of the lowest approved quote shall be reimbursed to the property owner upon satisfactory completion of the project and the submission of the contractor's invoice as approved by the City Engineering Department.

(Ord. 185-2022. Passed 8-22-22.)

(c) The property owner may choose to pay the contractor directly and receive a 50% reimbursement from the City upon satisfactory completion of the project or the City can pay the contractor directly and assess the property's owner's 50% share of the cost at 0% interest, to be paid semi-annually, to the property's owner's tax bill for a period of five (5) years. Either process is contingent upon approval of the project and the contractor's invoice by City Engineering.

(Ord. 158-2022. Passed 7-11-22.)

### 919.07 APPROVAL REQUIRED.

The City Engineer shall approve all plans, specifications, materials, and grades associated with the project; the project shall additionally be subject to all requirements contained in Chapters 905 and 907, as well as any other applicable chapters or sections of these Codified Ordinances. The participating property owners shall pay all fees required by Chapters 905 and 907 as well as any other applicable sections of these Codified Ordinances.

(Ord. 59-2001. Passed 4-9-01.)

### 919.08 REQUIREMENT OF LICENSED GENERAL SIDEWALK CONTRACTOR.

The general sidewalk contractor for each sidewalk replacement project shall meet all licensing and bonding requirements of Chapter 907 and all other applicable sections of these Codified Ordinances and the Ohio Revised Code. (Ord. 59-2001. Passed 4-9-01.)

### 919.09 CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS.

The Director of Public Service shall execute a contract with the participating property owners, as well as the general contractor, which shall detail the respective obligations of the parties. The contract shall provide as a minimum that the property owners and general contractor shall hold the City of Canton free and harmless from any expenses in excess of the responsibilities prescribed in Section 919.04, or liabilities associated with the project. The property owners shall be solely responsible for contracting with the general sidewalk contractor concerning construction of the replacement sidewalk, curb or combined curb and gutter unless the project is paid for up front by the City at 100% of the applicable costs with reimbursement as per Section 919.04.
