MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF FEBRUARY 10, 2003

The regular meeting of Canton City Council was held on Monday, February 10, 2003, at 7:30 P.M. in the Canton City Council Chamber. The meeting was called to order by President of Council Ray Denczak. The roll call was then taken (as follows) by Clerk of Council Debbie Vanckunas. The invocation was given by Councilmember John Mroczkowski, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by President of Council Denczak.

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: With a quorum being present, the Chair calls this meeting of Canton City Council to order. Roll call please.

MEMBER SMUCKLER: Mr. President, I move we adopt Resolution #15; seconded.

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: Clerk Vanckunas, would you please read the resolution?

READ BY CLERK OF COUNCIL VANCKUNAS: An Informal Resolution By: Mary M. Babcock, Councilmember-at-Large Dated: February 6, 2003. Whereas, Because it is a problem which affects us all in a very negative way, Canton citizens must be challenged to help prevent crime. The Canton Exchange Club, in cooperation with the Canton Police Department, the Stark County Prosecutor's Office & the Stark County Sheriff's Department sponsored the annual *Crime Prevention Week Award Breakfast* on Tuesday, February 4th, to kick off *Crime Prevention Week 2003*. The Breakfast affords the opportunity to recognize the selfless, dedicated services performed by top law officers who contribute beyond measure to preserving & protecting the quality of life within our

community; and Whereas, This year's "Canton Police Officer of the Year" is Lt. Dennis M. Pellegrino who was appointed to full-time duty in 1973, working assignments in Patrol, Traffic & Vice. In 1981, he was promoted to Sergeant and supervised Patrol & Traffic. Promoted to the rank of Lieutenant in 1984, he was assigned as commander of the Vice Unit, & the same year was appointed as lead police advisor of the Canton Police Youth Corps. From 1992 through '96, he was Agent-in-Charge of the Stark County Metropolitan Narcotics Unit. He became commander of the SWAT Unit in 1998. During the years 2000 through 2002, he was assigned full-time to the Stark County Violent Crimes Task Force as a Special Federal Officer & Special U.S. Deputy Marshall under the direction of the FBI. In April of 2002, he was appointed contact officer with the Joint Terrorism Task Force formed by the FBI's Cleveland Division regarding domestic & international terrorism. Currently, he is assigned as Lieutenant of Training in the Canton Police Training Bureau; and Whereas, Lieutenant Pellegrino is a seasoned, well-trained, competent officer, having completed many hours of specialized training & receiving instructor's certificates in several areas. He is the recipient of numerous professional awards & recognitions including a Recognition Award from the Stark Regional Community Corrections Center, Certificate of Appreciation from the DEA, Commendation from the Director of the FBI, Outstanding Performance Award from the International Narcotic Enforcement Officer's Association, Letters of Commendation from the U.S. Attorney General's Office & the Ohio Governor's Office of Criminal Justice Services, & recipient of the Public Servant of the Year Award; and Whereas, A graduate of Canton Lincoln High School, Dennis Pellegrino received an Ohio Basic Peace Officer Training Certificate from Kent State University's Student Police Academy, an Associate Degree of Applied Science in Criminal Justice Technology, & a Bachelor of Science Degree in Technical Education from the University of Akron. He is a man of duty, intellect & commitment. Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved: That we, the elected Members of the Council of the City of Canton, Ohio, do hereby go on public record as commending and congratulating LT. DENNIS M. PELLEGRINO for being recognized as this year's "Canton Police Officer of the Year" and for his resolution of purpose toward a citizenry he is sworn to serve & protect. Thank you, Lieutenant, for a job well done. (APPLAUSE)

Section 3, which provides for the terminal pay of employees hired between January 1, 1973 and December 31, 1983, is amended as written below, the purpose being to treat all similarly situated employees in the same manner.

151.092 TERMINAL PAY FOR EMPLOYEES HIRED BETWEEN JANUARY 1, 1973 AND DECEMBER 31, 1983.

- (a) Employees who were hired between January 1, 1973 and December 31, 1983, who retire prior to January 1, 2008, will receive a maximum of 150 days (1200 hours) of their accrued unused sick leave upon retirement at the employee's current rate of pay at the time of retirement.
- (b) The estate of a deceased employee who dies while in the employ of the City shall be entitled to receive payment according to the terms of subsection (a).
- (c) Employees covered by this section who elect to continue employment with the City beyond the time period set forth in subsection (a) shall thereafter be subject to Section 151.091.
- (d) This section shall terminate on January 1, 2008, whereupon all employees shall be subject to Section 151.091.
