ANNOUNCEMENT OF COMMITTEE MEETINGS

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: Announcement of Committee Meetings please.

MEMBER MROCZKOWSKI: Finance Committee will meet at 6:30 September 29, 2003, Council Caucus Room.

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: Anybody else?

MEMBER ALTIERI: Intergovernmental and Public Service will meet at the same time on the 29th.

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: Any other committees?... (NO RESPONSE)

PUBLIC SPEAKS (OPEN FORUM--CITY BUSINESS ONLY)

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: Public Speaks, Open Forum. We have two people signed up to speak this evening. The first speaker is Valerie Kirkland.

MS. KIRKLAND: My name is Valerie Kirkland. I live at 1317 - 41st Street NW. I am here again. I have been here off and on for the last four months. With our property, the first issue - safety issues. I have spoke to four individuals that are standing, or actually sitting in front of me, saying that there would be no problem to put a street light up on the street behind our home. If it's not a big issue and something easy to fix, why is it taking so long? That means also we had promises to myself and to my husband, and promises weren't followed through. We ended up calling the AEP, and they do not have any records of anybody calling in regards to this matter. Also, the same four individuals had walked streets with us in our area. They are aware of the safety issue with open drainage water pipes. They are very corroded. I am very concerned for my children walking up the street to go to the park. We have no sidewalks. Some of the properties do, but these pipes are bare, they're open, and if they fall through, you're probably looking at some problems. This is an issue that, again, at least four people sitting in front of me are definitely aware of this situation. I do have children safety is one of my main issues. And, I don't see much being done. And calling a street sweeper out at 10:00 at night on a school night is not appropriate. I live on a side street, not a main city street. You kept up teachers and people that have to get up at 4:00 - 5:00 in the morning to almost 11-- I'd say close to 11:00 PM with that street sweeper going up and down our street. It was almost a punch to us like somebody was doing this for a joke, and it was not a joking matter. The next thing I do need to say is that I am glad that they started a project on Shanabruck. They had started the project a couple weeks ago with catch basins. Again, I ask for the same four individuals to please, if you want to tonight if it's raining, please stop by and look at the catch basins. They are only catching 10% of the water that is coming down Shanabruck. You may have detoured the water a little bit, but now into my front yard, I have four to five feet wide of water in my front yard. So we definitely have a problem. If that was a band aid, due to the rain, the band aid has fallen off. This is a newer project and I know it's not completed yet, but the one side of the catch basin that was fixed and is completed, is not catching the water. It is up, they have cemented around it, the cement is several inches higher than the street itself. It cannot catch the water. So I hope in all matters that the individuals, especially the four Council representatives, will please go back and look at the projects that you're paying to be -- issuing out to be done. And if it's not done correctly, are we add-- are we going ahead and paying these people for doing a project that is not working?

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: Ma'am, I'm sorry, but your three minutes are up. Just, wait....

MEMBER SMUCKLER: Mr. President...

PRESIDENT DENCZAK:wait. Remain at the microphone.

MEMBER SMUCKLER: Mr. Miller, I walked back in at the end of this. I was one of the individuals that she's talking about. Did you call AEP like I asked you to to discuss this?

SERVICE DIRECTOR MILLER: I called AEP in June when the meeting was held out in the neighborhood after the May 15th storm; followed that up because I had called to find out what had happened with the work order. Because it was verbal, apparently they lost it, so we followed it up in writing. I will have a copy of the communication to AEP down here in your Council box, and I mailed it out to the Kirklands here this week, because basically AEP doesn't know what they have. They called the 1-800 number in Columbus. The 1-800 number in Columbus, they don't even know where Canton is. Most of the people down there, when you call -- and I'm not sure who they talked to at AEP locally, but Ken Huot is aware of the problem, that's who we addressed the communication to, and the order has been put in for the street light.

MEMBER SMUCKLER: Ms. Kirkland, he's going to mail you a copy of that 'cause I want you to be on record that we did what we said we were gonna do. That's number one. Mr. Miller, do we clean streets at 10:00 at night?

SERVICE DIRECTOR MILLER: Yes, we do.

MEMBER SMUCKLER: Do we do it on side streets and neighborhoods too like this?

SERVICE DIRECTOR MILLER: There was a standing order that I'm going to have to probably talk to the people about that anytime it rains up in that area -- because that was a complaint that we received not only at the neighborhood meeting, but was repeated again on a number of occasions here in Council -- that every time it rains, there's gravel all over the streets and it's dangerous. Afternoon shift must not have had any other work that was pressing at that point in time so they took the street sweeper out and did what they were told to do, which is sweep after a rain storm.

MEMBER SMUCKLER: I understand, Mr. Miller. Could we have a little bit more reasonable hour in that neighborhood based on us going out there and taking a look at that? Number three, could you please go view the project before we finish paving so we don't run into the same problem of -- maybe the problem that we have out on Georgeview Estates where the road is higher in the middle of the road, and we get this paved correctly so the water swalled into the right area. Could you please go out and view this personally?

SERVICE DIRECTOR MILLER: It will be inspected. It is not complete yet, so therefore, it will be inspected before final payment is made.

MEMBER SMUCKLER: Did I miss anything?

MS. KIRKLAND: Not this time. I'll give you -- next Monday I've got more.

MEMBER SMUCKLER: I'm trying.

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: Member Smuckler. Ma'am, you mentioned something about catch basins aren't doing their job?

MS. KIRKLAND: Yes.

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: What's that about?

MS. KIRKLAND: Well, some of the new ones that they installed -- and the one is completed on Shanabruck on one side -- there's barely any water going into it, so we're still having the flooding between -- it's like an alley way in between two homes at the end of Shanabruck.

MEMBER SMUCKLER: Mr. President, I went out there the other day after the Isabel-supposed rain that we got and spoke to the Kirklands, and they told me everything at that point in time was okay. Since that point in time with the rain that we had today, which was probably harder than the other day, I think that's -- Mr. President, I think that's what Ms. Kirkland's referring to is that we have to get Mike out there to make sure that that pavement is swalled correctly so the water goes into those two catch basins.

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: Okay. Thank you.

MS. KIRKLAND: Thank you.

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: The next speaker is Bill Aston.

MR. ASTON: Good evening, Council. My name is Bill Aston. I live at 1924 Dennison NW, City of Canton. My issue tonight is -- actually it was on the agenda, I didn't realize it -- but under the second reading it was Ordinance #11 --Dominion East Ohio, the Shell Energy ordeal. I received a bill for this past month, it was \$133.00 from Dominion, and I said what's up with this. And I thought well, maybe the meter was wrong and I started looking at my back bills. In fact I spent a whole afternoon looking them over, writing them out, actually putting them on the computer so I could see what was going on. And what I found is a couple of months I had credits, and then I started looking and I found one issue where Dominion had made an incorrect meter reading. And, they only read every other month, one month it's a remote which is an actual reading, and then another time it's the estimate. Well, so I started looking more into it and realized what had happened, and the big bill, the \$133.00, was catching up. They had given me several credits and then this was kind of a catch up deal. So that didn't make me too happy. I'd rather just pay my bills as they come through. So I started looking a little further at -- like I said, I actually put all this on a spread sheet -- and started looking at some of the other costs, and this is where Shell Energy comes in, and we see it's coming up for renewal, and I got my letter. I am on that program. But I started looking at the Dominion bill, and the delivery costs from Dominion went from last winter at \$1.56 per unit of gas that you use on top of your fee, then over the summer three months it was .74 a unit, and beginning in August and September, it's up to \$3.53. You add that together, and on this \$133.00 bill I had, there was \$44.58 for delivery and \$77.00 for the gas. That's quite a bit, and you add that all together, you get \$9.71 a unit. Now, I also have another letter I got recently from Dominion, \$7.75. And after I talked to Dominion and we discussed it for quite a while, asking them why can't they read my meter correctly and those other things -- which is not an issue for the Council -- then

I asked about this \$3.53 delivery, and I said were we informed, and they said yeah, we sent a letter. Well, I don't remember receiving it, but the woman from Dominion send she would re-send me a letter on that. I hung up from there and I called the Law Department and I talked with Jane of the Law Department -- I'm sure most of you know her -- and we had a few minute discussion and I kinda recapped what I just told you, and she's going to look into that, she's going to revisit this and to see-- When the City made this agreement with Shell apparently a year ago, whenever this last contract was, they looked at the delivery cost from Dominion and still assured us that we were getting a better deal with this. Now...

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: Bring your remarks to a close, please.

MR. ASTON: I'll wrap up. With that-- with the current rate that we have in this letter from Dominion-- or excuse me, from Shell, and the \$3.53 rate, we'll be at \$10.38 per unit.

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: Thank you.

SERVICE DIRECTOR MILLER: Mr. President, for the record, the delivery cost is \$1.38. That's set by Dominion and the Public Utilities Commission on top of the rate that we establish with Shell when the rate is set. The fixed price for November, December, January, February, March of this coming year, for those that are in the opt out program, is \$6.85 per thousand cubic feet, including the delivery cost. The delivery cost should not be changing and rather than talking with Dominion, you're best call would be down to the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio because they're the ones that establish what that delivery cost is, and if it's fluctuating, something's wrong.

MR. ASTON:Okay. I've got a whole year's worth of bills, and it was steady for three months, then it went to .74 and back up. Thank you.

SERVICE DIRECTOR MILLER: It should be a set price per thousand cubic feet just like the price per thousand cubic feet is set. So there should be a fixed price off to the side and that should be approximately \$1.38.

MR. ASTON: That doesn't surprise me. Dominion -- we were talking about AEP a few minutes ago. You know, you're never sure where they're coming from. Thanks for the information.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: We are now under Miscellaneous Business. Is there any Miscellaneous Business? Members of Council, I don't know if you noticed it or not, but the City Auditor, Perez, is walking around here with a sad and dejected face. Recently he was in charge of the security for the Kansas City Cheerleaders when they came to Canton for the Hall of Fame weekend, and he got a place mat signed by one of the cheerleaders -- and he was so tickled to get that -- only to find out that Bev is the one that gave him the place mat... (*LAUGHER*)and not one of the Kansas cheerleaders. Now, I couldn't see one of the cheerleaders coming on to Kim Perez. I could see maybe one of the players, but... (*LAUGHTER*)not the cheerleaders, so that's why he's got the sad face. Is there any other Miscellaneous Business?...

MEMBER SMUCKLER: Mr. President, I move we adjourn; seconded..

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: Moved and seconded that you adjourn. Roll call vote please.

NO REMARKS PERMITTED ON THE MOTION TO ADJOURN ROLL CALL: 11 YEAS, 0 NAYS
