Whereas, many properties in the City of Canton are neglected and left to deteriorate by their owners, creating an eyesore and lowering property values in the neighborhood in which they are located; and Whereas, the property located at 1109 4<sup>th</sup> Street NW has been an ongoing problem for the Canton City

Health Department since October 29, 2001. On three separate occasions, criminal charges were filed against the owner due to the unsafe and unsanitary condition of the premises, the latest summons being issued on September 10, 2004. On August 26, 2004, the water was officially "shut off" to the property; and Whereas, this property has been the site of numerous complaints, not only to the Health Department, but the Police Department as well. This year alone, the Canton City Police responded to this location five times in March, one time in April, three times in May, one time in June, three times in July, two times in August, and one time in September. As late as November 24, 2004, there were two police calls, one at 8:30 AM, reference pick-up of a wanted subject, and the second at 10:00 AM involving the Vice Unit; and Whereas, in an effort to help make our neighborhoods safer, cleaner places to live, we must revitalize these areas by demolishing properties such as 1109 4<sup>th</sup> Street NW.

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that we, the members of the Council of the City of Canton, do hereby go on public record requesting the Safety Director to declare the property located at 1109 4<sup>th</sup> Street NW a public nuisance, and to proceed accordingly for the demolition of same.
