And the Chair would hope that you take the time to respond to this communication from the Air Traffic Control Operator's Union. It's relative to the closing down of the control tower at the Akron Canton Airport from 12:00 midnight to 5:00 AM in the morning. And this is imposing a serious endangering of safety for both passengers and the air crew for the purpose of cost saving. This is another decision by the FAA which causes a lot of people to question their ability to control air traffic. If this occurs, and those of you who may fly Red Eyes during those hours of the day, either departing or arriving at Akron Canton Airport, there will be no one in the tower, no one to control the aircraft as to how to enter the traffic pattern to land. You'll have to depend on the remote radar station which is not good. If you have an emergency on the aircraft or if you have an emergency on the ground, vou'll not be able to communicate in time to get any service. No one will be able to give you the altimeter setting, the condition of the runway, the wind direction, the ILS is operating, the GCA is operating. The ILS is instrument landing system, GCA is ground control approach. If these systems aren't operating, I pity anybody who's coming into that airport at that hour of the day or taking off at that hour of the day. So I'd ask that you respond to that because it's serious. We brag about how Akron Canton is improving and increasing, and now the FAA wants to do this to us. And I talked to Congressman Regula and he's working on it, and I'd appreciate it if you guys would take an active part if you do any flying. Thank you. Is there any miscellaneous business?...

MEMBER BERNABEI: Speaking of concerns about -- serious concerns about passenger safety, are you still flying? (LAUGHTER)

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: No, I landed last night. I'm here now. (CONTINUED LAUGHTER)

MEMBER CARBENIA: Mr. President... Mr. President....

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: Who's calling?

MEMBER CARBENIA: Carbenia. Mr. Bernabei stole my thunder there, because I thought, well, the reason they were doing this is because when you come in, you come in blindfolded anyway, so they don't want to do it. (CHUCKLES) (LAUGHTER)
