Then, back up in the neighborhood on my street I didn't see any and then after yesterday, I saw one in front of the house next to me, the Nashes, the one on the pole said 25, which I thought was too fast and the reason why I'm saying this sir is because yesterday there was a police chase on our street and there was five cars hit and it was awful fast and then they stopped. The car chase got on foot, you know, which was better but meantime there was five cars hit and I had just tried to catch Mr. Hunt but I think he was gone or something, I don't know, to let him know what I thought about the speed limit and they all say that they don't want to listen to me because I'm nobody, but I'm somebody because I was born and raised in Canton, Ohio. I've had bad times, which a lot of people have had and, but I've survived to this stage of my life and somebody, I have been calling your Police Department about somebody entering my home. They don't break in, somehow they get in and I've had the locks changed three times and, I just would like to let you know about that. And, I, as I'm saying, and I told Kelly, I think that these young people are watching these movies, the videos and movies on Star Channel or whatever channel concerning running elderly people out of the neighborhood but, as we came up, everybody lived together, elderly and young. You know what I'm saying? And they are doing aggravating things and last night when I did call your Policemen, after they cleared out the cars and all that and let them know somebody was throwing stuff up against my house, they were there. And, I think, whoever it was, that was pretty fast, but, they was kinda slow in getting the mess cleared out and they was slow about getting the ambulance, maybe like 2 hours or so, getting the ambulance, they put this kid in the ambulance. I didn't see any blood, but you never know what's wrong on the inside, you know, like broken bones or something and, one of the cars that was hit, but they finally got there and just listening to other people, they was, you know, complaining because why weren't they there sooner. And, I'm beckoning to my, our Mayor, that maybe she could take some of the funds that she's paying these people who are up there and not common people like us and put the bike police back in that neighborhood. You still have that office over at the concerned citizen's building on the northeast side, we need them because when we had them, we didn't have all these problems.

PRESIDENT DENCZAK: Ma'am, your three minutes are up. Please bring your remarks to a close.

MS. SMITH: Well, okay, that, that about cleared it out, what I had to say and you know, I just thank you and I wish you guys would consider some of these things, you know because we have to vote for you and we're all, and I'm, I'm in danger. I'm a senior, and I been at my place like 30-some years. It's nice to have an apartment, and get rid of my junk and I like my junk, I don't wanna get rid of my junk and I don't wanna get rid of my junk and I don't wanna get rid of my house.
