Group, and **Whereas:** Ms. Alice Sarver, has shown a commitment to the Canton area through her years of attendance at City Council meetings and her integral leadership and procurement efforts in the Steese Project, which helped alleviate a tremendous flooding problem in the area, and **Now, Therefore,** I, William J. Healy II, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Canton, Ohio do hereby declare March 15, 2008 as **Alice M. Sarver Day** For her many accomplishments and successes during the past 70 years and her unwavering commitment to the betterment of the Canton area.

(APPLAUSE)

ALICE SARVER: Thank you Cindy. I just want to say thank you and ah...this is...this was such a surprise and I love the City of Canton and I just...I just want to see it be a great City to live in and just pull people in and give people the opportunity to be great neighbors to one another. Thank you.

(APPLAUSE)

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: Well Alice, we love you being here and we wish you many healthy and happy returns. Happy Birthday again.

MEMBER CARBENIA: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: One of the very few people that is actually older than me. (Laughter) Member Carbenia.

MEMBER CARBENIA: Except for Carbenia too. (*Laughter*) If I could Alice, I would like to thank you for all your years of ah...service to the City, ah...working...ah...non payed work. Ah....I know that you've...ah....you've been a dynamo I know for....ah....for...ah... Butchy, helping him to get those things done up there and the only thing that I would like to ask is...ah....I'd like to get a half a dozen pictures from the photographer. I thought he was going up there to propose, he was down on his knees. (*Laughter*) Um...I wish you luck.

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: Thank you Member Carbenia. Law Director Martuccio.

LAW DIRECTOR MARTUCCIO: Thank you Mr. President. I wanted to ah...supplement my answer to Member Cirelli. I was ah...partially mistaken...ah, I noticed that in Ordinance #11, that goes to Water Treatment...ah plant, not the Water Pollution Control Center. However, my answer stays about the same. This is a very complicated piece of engineering...ah...that I would hazard to guess is something that can only be undertaken by ah...the most experienced professionals on the largest of scales and it was done, as it will be done rather, by um...having already been...ah...advertised and...and so on and it will be bid. Um...and again, the same hold true of any Bond Council work that may have to be done in the future. Ah..with regard to Ms. Kirk, um...I will be consulting with the Service Director when he is unburied from his many and varied duties that he's been overwhelmed with on the status of the Tree Ordinance that you and so many people have worked so diligently on. When the plans...ah..have been completed for the fire station proposal at 25th and Cleveland, we'll have a better idea of what may or not become of those trees. And on the issue of Land Banking...um...we have a pretty active Administration and a Service Director...ah...combining forces with the County and other...ah...offices..ah..to see what kinds of benefits can be derived from the new State Law, allowing quicker and easier forfeitures of lands of lots that are not build able and have...ah...burdens on them. Thank you for asking.

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: Thank you Law Director Martuccio. Any other comments?

MEMBER CIRELLI: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: Ah...Member Cirelli.

MEMBER CIRELLI: Ah...question to...ah...Law Director Martuccio. Thank you for clarifying because I was going to ask you that question, so that's one that's out of the way. Ah...I don't know whether you saw in Sunday's paper, March 9th, "Housing Inspection Debated Over in Alliance." Did you follow that or not? Which right away triggered in my mind when I was asking you about the licensing of landlords...ah...can you tell me, what do we charge for an inspection? This on a bi-annual, they want to charge possibly \$100.00 to help the City recoup the cost of...of inspecting.

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: Law Director Martuccio.

LAW DIRECTOR MARTUCCIO: Thank you Mr. President. Member Cirelli, I would yield, if Council would permit it to John Labriola. I don't know what the fee is for our um...Occupant.....Certificates of Occupancy.

MEMBER CARBENIA: I would ask that he is allowed to talk to Mr. President.

MEMBER CIRELLI: Seconded.

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: It's been moved and seconded to allow John Labriola to address ah...Member Cirelli's question. Any remarks? All those in favor say aye. Those opposed no.

NO REMARKS MOTION APPROVED BY UNANIMOUS VOICE VOTE

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: The motion carries. Director. Well if Casar could only see you now. (Making reference to Mr. Labriola sitting in Member Casar's seat) (Laughter) You sort of look like Don though, better looking though. (Laughter)

CHIEF BUILDING OFFICIAL JOHN LABRIOLA: Mary, to answer your question, the registration fee is \$50.00 per single family dwelling and then the Certificate of Occupancy is \$50.00 but it goes for five years.

MEMBER CIRELLI: So, Mr. President. Um...Mr. Labriola, I assume you seen this also in the paper then? And ah...you know.... Mr. President, again, I was looking at the aspect of possibly charging a rental fee for landlords owning properties that are actually making a business out of this...out of our community. And we see it all over the City of Canton and I'm not talking about the mom and pop people that just maybe buy property next door to them and clean it up and take care of it. I'm talking about the ones that are making a living, and most of them don't even live in Canton. And so that's why when I saw this \$100.00 which is biannual, I thought well if we can't get the...ah...licensing of a landlords, maybe this is another way we can get some money to help our community services that we provide for them..ah..you know the departments to get money into our coffers. So I just wanted your opinion on what you thought of it sir.

CHIEF BUILDING OFFICIAL JOHN LABRIOLA: Director Nesbitt and I have been in conversation in regards to making changes to the code enforcement and I'm sure that we will be discussing this further. Ah...the possibility of registering landlords maybe a good way to go or try.

MEMBER CIRELLI: Alright, I appreciate it and if you would apprise me of what you may come up with, I'd be more than open to assist with that sir and Director Nesbitt.

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: Thank you very much. Thank you. Ah...Law Director Martuccio.

LAW DIRECTOR MARTUCCIO: Thank you Mr. President. And Member Cirelli, to follow up on your observation of that article, Law Director, Alliance Law Director Zumbar, I think properly opined that any costs have to be related to the actual generation of costs. Ah...they have to actually reflect what is expended in salaries and so on. That's a good point that he made. Um...in addition to to that, he wanted to be careful to treat everyone equally under the law and to not have any un voted taxes.

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: Any other remarks, Member Cirelli?

MEMBER CIRELLI: No sir, thank you.

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: Thank you very much.

MEMBER CARBENIA: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: Member Carbenia.

MEMBER CARBENIA: I move we adjourn.

MEMBER CIRELLI: Seconded.

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: Ah...it's been moved and seconded to adjourn, ah...Madame Clerk, roll call vote please.

NO REMARKS ROLL CALL: 8 YEAS, 0 NAYS

CLERK TIMBERLAKE: Eight yeas, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT SCHULMAN: Meeting is adjourned. Thank you and Happy Birthday again Alice. (Gavel

falls)
